God of Wonders Part 2: Genesis - Joshua

Unit 9, Lesson 43

God Sends Manna

Exodus 16:1-36

Running time: Approximately 6 minutes

Set: The set for God of Wonders Units 7-10 is designed as a seventeenth century pirate ship viewed from the port (left) side. The Caribbean Queen's bow is stage right. On stage left, there is a raised wheelhouse with a door to the Captain's quarters. Characters and puppets may pop up from several trap doors in the deck and from the crow's nest near the top of the center stage mast. There is a pulley system to raise the treasure chest from below deck where the Bible is kept. For added interest, build windows, entrances, and levels where the characters and puppets can pop up unexpectedly.

<u>Characters</u>: Cody is one of Captain Billy Ocean's "skater" nephews. He is fairly simple, speaks in surfer terms, and is excited by most things, especially God's Word. Matey (Nigel) is a simple, sweet-natured midshipman with a true servant's heart.

Plot: Cody is complaining about always having to eat fish. Matey tells him about when the Israelites grumbled and how God provided manna and quail for them to eat. We learn we should be grateful to God because He always gives us just what we need.

<u>Costumes</u>: Cody: Skater caps, skater shorts, knee socks, sandals; Matey: Striped shirt, stocking cap, short trousers (Capri pants), slippers

Props: Bibles, treasure chest

Sound effects (SFX):

- 1. Intro/Outro music suggestion: "Pirate Theme" from productiontrax.com tracks #19253 or #40794
- 2. Treasure chest suggestion: Music with voiceover as chests opens to reveal Bible: "His Words for you are treasures true!"

Visual effects (VFX):

- 1. Video Intro is available at ResourceWell.org
- 2. Treasure chest contains the Bible. Whenever it is opened, light shines out and music with voiceover plays.
- 3. Scripture slide: Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will rain down bread from heaven for you." Exodus 16:4a
- 4. Closing Slide: "May the God of Wonders fill your sails and guide your path!"

Adaptations:

- 1. Sound Effects: instead of using recorded effects, have children make the sounds
- 2. Voiceovers: may be spoken off stage

Voice over (VFX: Video bump)

Ahoy lads and lassies! There be a legend centuries old of a lost treasure, more valuable than gold! Though the pirates searched both land and sea, they could not find where it might be! Until Captain Billy sailed the ocean blue and brought that treasure home to you. So grab yer treasure map, climb aboard the Caribbean Queen and join us as Captain Billy Ocean and his crew unveil the greatest wonders God has ever shown!

Cody (pops up)

Yo! What up, little dudes? It is I, Cody. So far, living onboard the Caribbean Queen has been pretty rough! They don't get cable TV, there's no place to skateboard, and all they eat is fish for every meal! Dudes, I would give anything for a grande burrito with hot sauce!

Matey (pops up) Ahoy there, Cody!

Cody

Yo, what up, dude?

Matey (stares overhead)

I don't know! I suppose there are clouds and some birds and of course, there's Heaven.

Cody

No dude, what up is just an expression, like, "How are you?"

Matey

I'm fine, sir or madam, but, you're in a spot of trouble.

Cody

Uh-oh! What did I do now?

Matey

Cap'n Billy told you to wash all the dishes and the pots and pans, but the sink is still full of dishes!

Cody

Oh man, I don't feel like doing dishes. That kitchen always smells like fish!

Matey

That's because we had fish pancakes for breakfast!

Codv

I know, gross me out! I'm sick of eating fish. Dude, why don't we ever have Taco Bell?!

Matev

You should never grumble about what you eat, sir or madam. You should be grateful to God for the food He sends to you.

Cody

What? God didn't send me that fish. I saw Simeon catch a whole mess of flounder just yesterday.

Matey

Well, Simeon may have caught them but God provided them. God always sends us what we need. Here, I'll get out the Traysure map and show ya! (Opens treasure chest, <u>SFX</u>: Voiceover with music, <u>VFX</u>: light shines from Treasure Chest) Remember how God saved the Israelites?

<u>Cody</u>

Yeah dude, God parted the Rad Sea!

Matev

That's Red Sea, sir or madam.

Codv

Right! And the Israelites crossed over to the other side and they were, like, totally safe!

Matey

They were safe and free but they were hungry in the middle of a hot, sandy desert without food.

Cody

But they were just happy to be free and not have to be Pharaoh's slaves anymore, right?

Matey

Actually they were miserable. The Bible says, they grumbled and complained against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us out of Egypt? Now we're going to starve to death in the desert!"

Cody

Wow, they should have been happy that God had saved them!

Matey (VFX: Scripture Slide)

That's what Moses thought, but God always takes care of His people, even if they grumble! The Bible says, Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will rain down bread from heaven for you.

Cody

Cool! What did God do, drop loaves of Wonder Bread from the sky?

Matev

That would make Him the God of Wonder bread! But, no he didn't send loaves. He sent manna! It's a kind of bread. The Bible says thin flakes like frost appeared on the ground.

Cody

God sent Frosted Flakes?! They're great! Did he pour milk down from Heaven too?

<u>Matey</u>

No! It wasn't cereal. It was manna, bread!

Codv

Banana bread?!

Matey

Not Banana bread! Manna, manna!

Cody

Man alive, that's cool. Did they taste like nachos?

<u>Matey</u>

They tasted like wafers made with honey.

Cody

Sounds delicious! Did the Israelites fill their tents with manna?

Matev

No, they were only able to keep as much as they could eat for one day.

Capt.

Dude, I'd be stuffin' my pockets with those heavenly nachos!

Matey

If you did that, the next day your pockets would stink and be filled with maggots.

Cody

Ewww! Dude, that's totally gross!

Matey

Aye, you see, instead of them storing food, God wanted them to depend on Him every day.

Codv

What about weekends?

Matev

Well, the day before the Sabbath God would send twice as much. That way they wouldn't have to collect manna on the day of rest.

Codv

But wouldn't it get stinky?

Matev

Nope, that was the only time that the bread would last two days.

Cody

Oh, it's like the Lord's Prayer, "give us this day our daily bread!" But dude, did he send anything else?

Matey

The first night before God sent manna, He sent quail.

Cody

A whale! No way, they could eat an entire whale, dude!

Matey

Not a whale! How could there be a whale in the middle of the desert?

Cody

You never know with God. He can do like, miracles and stuff.

Sandy

That is true, sir, but this was quail - small birds that taste like chicken!

Cody

Cool, did they have to drive to Kentucky Fried Quail?

Matey

No! They didn't have Kentucky Fried Quail back then!

Cody

Then where'd they get the buckets of quail?

Matev

It didn't come in buckets. God just sent it.

Cody

So like, God's people were hungry so He sent one night's worth of quail and then 40 years worth of manna?

Matey

Aye, just what they needed each day. God always gives us just what we need! He wouldn't let His children go hungry. Oh speaking of hunger, I've got to start dinner!

Cody

What are we having, fish again?

Matey

Nope, quesadillas.

Cody

Quesadillas! No way! Can I help?

Matey

Sure, after you do the dishes.

Cody

You got it, dude!

Matey

So long, kids! See you next time!

Cody (SFX: Outro music)

May the God of Wonders fill your burrito and guide your chimichanga! (VFX: Closing slide)

Matey

That's not how it goes!

(they exit)
