# David and Mephibosheth

2 Samuel 9:1-11

Suggested setting: The Kings & Kingdoms puppet scripts adapt to any setting such as a garden, forest, farm, or stable. Once or twice a year, a set change or addition to the set is recommended for added interest. Decorate with colorful flowers, butterflies, birds, and ladybugs. Puppets can pop out from behind a window, hedge, tree hollow, stonewall, etc. For a simple, portable puppet stage, puppets can pop up from behind a colorful blanket hung on a rod or from behind a card table turned on its side. Adjust setting and puppet names according to available puppeteers and resources.

<u>Characters</u>: Delbert the Donkey and Lello the Lamb are good friends who are always excited to learn more about Jesus and the Bible. The leader is the children's teacher or worship leader dressed in regular clothing or in costume consistent with the set (a gardener, a farmer, etc.) The leader helps children focus on the puppets and leads group interaction.

Leader (Stands at puppet stage.)
It's time to call for Delbert and Lello.
Repeat after me, "Dehhhhhl-bert
Dehhhhhl-bert!" (Children repeat and
Delbert the Donkey pops head out of
window.) "Hellohhhhhhhhhhhh Lello!"
(Children repeat and Lello the Lamb pops
head out of window.)

<u>Delbert</u> (Delbert pops up.) **Hee Haw!** 

#### Leader

Hi, Delbert. Where's Lello?

<u>Delbert</u>

She was running too slowly and I didn't want to wait.

Leader

Delbert, that doesn't sound like something a friend would do.

<u>Delbert</u>

Haw? It doesn't?

**Leader** 

No. Remember when you two made promises to be kind to each other forever?

Delbert

That's right. Boys and girls, should I go back and get Lello?

Leader with Children

Yes!

Delbert

I'll be right back. (Delbert pops down.)

Leader

Let's call for Lello again. Ready? "Hellohhhhhhhhhhhh Lello!" (Children repeat and Lello pops up.)

<u>Lello</u> (breathless from running) Hello every-bahhh-dy.

## **Leader**

Hello, Lello. We're glad you're here. Today, we are learning about David and Mephibosheth.

<u>Delbert</u> (thinks Leader sneezed) God bless you.

## Lello

Can you tell us the story?

# <u>Leader</u>

Sure! Remember when David promised to be kind to Jonathan's family?

# **Delbert and Lello**

Yes!

## **Leader**

Well, years later, David became king. He still kept his promise; he invited someone from Jonathan's family to his house.

#### Lello

Who did he invite?

#### Leader

Mephibosheth.

<u>Delbert</u> (thinks Leader sneezed) Bless you again! Need a tissue?

#### Leader

Delbert, Mephibosheth was the man's name.

#### **Delbert**

Oh! I thought you were catching a cold.

Meph-phib-bo-sheth. I like that name. Let's all say it together.

# <u>Lello, Leader, Delbert, and Children</u> Meph-phib-bo-sheth!

#### Leader

Great job! Now, Mephibosheth could not walk. It was hard for him to go places with his friends. King David showed kindness and invited him to always eat at the king's table. You see, God wants us to include everyone.

## Lello

Yeah. It's no fun when you're left out.

## **Delbert**

No, it's not. Lello, I'm sorry I left you today when we were running. Would you like to come have a picnic with me?

# Lello

Yeah. That sounds great! Bah-bye every-bahhh-dy.

# **Delbert**

See you guys later. (braying)

#### Leader

We'll see you soon.

(All exit.)
