Scripture Reading: Ephesians 3:14-18

Bless and collect the offering. Sing songs and worship God.

Perform Worship Illustration or read Storybook.

3. THE WORD THE BIBLE IS GOD'S STORY

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Genesis 1:1, Exodus 15:13, Isaiah 45:5-6.

Find It First. Highlight Key Verse: Exodus 15:13. Pray.

4. THE WAY TRUST THE EVIDENCE; TELL THE STORY

P What is your favorite Bible story? (Respond. List on pad.) **If we look for it, we can see God's love in each of these stories. How does each of your favorite Bible stories show us that God loves us?** (Respond.)

CHRIST CONNECTION> Reveal: Jn. 3:16, Mt. 28:19-20, Rev. 21:3-5. Find It First.

> After Moses spoke of God's unfailing love, all people continued to sin. When Isaiah spoke, most people worshipped false gods. Most Israelites had turned away from God. Some truly loved God and faithfully tried to do what was right, but no one was perfect. Even so, God's love never failed. 700 years after Isaiah spoke, God sent His Son. (Read John 3:16.)

P Jesus died on the cross so that we could have eternal life. He wanted everyone to have the chance to believe. (Read Matthew 28:19-20.) **Eternal life is life forever close to God.** (Respond.) **God gave John a vision of heaven.** (Read Revelation 21:3-5.) **What did the voice from the throne of God say about the words in the Bible?** (They are trustworthy and true.)

> You can trust the story of God to be true. Some may be surprised to hear this. You can show historical evidence and recent discoveries that confirm its trustworthiness.

> Even with evidence, you need faith to believe that every word is from God and is true. Ask God for this kind of faith. (Read Titus 1:1-3.)

P If you met someone who had never heard of the Bible or Jesus, how would you tell him or her the true story of God in your own words?

P Why is important to tell the story? (Respond.)

THE GOLDEN BOWL> Pray for individual names and the Lord's Prayer.
