Advent 3: Jesus Is Born

Lesson Aim: To consider the miracle of the Savior coming near to us as a baby.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite thing about babies?

GAME: Near and Far

THE WORSHIP THE GOD WHO COMES NEAR

Read Worship Scripture: Luke 2:6-7.

Sing songs and worship God.

Bless and collect the offering.

Advent Candle Lighting Ceremony: The Bethlehem Candle

Perform High Seas Adventures script or read storybook.

THE WORD JESUS IS BORN

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God sent His angel Gabriel to prepare Mary for the birth of Jesus.

Point to Jesus on Earth (Circa 1-33 A.D.). **Today, we will hear how Jesus came into the world as a baby with a humble birth in a manger. He was born in a small town in Israel called Bethlehem.** Point to Bethlehem. **This story may be familiar to you. If so, as we read, look for something new that God might show you about Jesus' birth.**

Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Luke 2:4-7. Pray. Read.

THE WAY GOD CAME NEAR TO US

When baby Jesus was born, what did Mary wrap Him in for warmth? (Cloths.) Where did Mary place Him? (In a manger.) A manger is a box filled with hay or food for animals. Why did Mary have to place Him in a manger? (There was no room in the inn.) The manger was probably inside some sort of stable for animals. Imagine God's own Son sleeping in a manger with stable animals nearby. Mary wrapped baby Jesus in cloths. Give a cloth strip to each child. **Let this soft strip of baby cloth remind you of the way Jesus came near to us. Tie the cloth around your wrist so it is close to your skin. Let its closeness remind you of Jesus being near to you.**

Raise your hand if you have ever helped care for a baby. What did you do? Could baby Jesus have done those things for Himself? (No.) Mary took care of baby Jesus. What makes a baby special? As a baby, Jesus was special in all those ways.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Through the appearance of angels, God came near to many people like Abraham, Hagar, Jacob, Zechariah, Mary, and Joseph. God came near to Moses through the burning bush, the pillar of cloud at the Red Sea, and on Mount Sinai. Let's review what happened on Mount Sinai when God came near to Moses to give him the Ten Commandments. Reveal Exodus 19:16-20. Read.

What do you think it would have been like to stand on Mount Sinai when God came near? What do you think it would have been like to stand by the manger when baby Jesus was born? Only Moses was allowed to be near God on Mount Sinai. Who was allowed to come near baby Jesus? (Anyone.)

What did Jesus grow up to do? (He died on the cross to save us.) God came near to us as a baby. He was born, just like each of us, so He could grow up to save us from life forever without Him. Now that Jesus has returned to heaven, anyone who believes in Him can be near Him forever, now on earth and later in heaven.

Let's think about the amazing miracle of the God who created the heavens and the earth coming to be with us as a baby. Shepherds and even stable animals could see Him. Why do you think He came this way? Jesus came in a way that anyone could come near Him.
