Healing the Deaf and Mute Man

Lesson Aim: To hear the salvation message, to be invited to respond to it, and to share it with others.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite sound?

GAME: Silent Hunt

THE WORSHIP JESUS AS THE GOD OF HEALING

Read Worship Scripture: Romans 10:9.

Sing songs and worship God.

Bless and collect the offering.

Lead children in the ABC Prayer.

Perform Bonzai Brothers script or read storybook.

THE WORD JESUS HEALED THE DEAF AND MUTE MAN

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: Jesus healed the sick woman.

Today, we find out about the healing of a deaf and mute man. The people brought him to Jesus when He came into the region of the Decapolis. Point to the Decapolis region. The man in this story was deaf and mute. Deaf means he could not hear; mute means he could not speak. It is likely that he could not speak because of his deafness or because his tongue did not work correctly. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Mark 7:32-37. Pray. Read.

THE WAY JESUS CAN HEAL OUR HEARTS

Why did the people bring the deaf and mute man to Jesus? (For healing.) **Where did Jesus take the man?** (Away from the crowd.) **If Jesus came here now and spent time alone with you, what do you think He would say to you? What would you want to say to Him?**

What did Jesus do to heal the man? (Put his fingers in the man's ears, spit and touched the man's tongue, looked up to heaven, and said, "Ephphatha!" meaning "be opened.") **Jesus can open our ears to hear,**

our tongues to speak, and our hearts to believe in Him.

Jesus healed the man. In what ways can Jesus heal us? Jesus can heal us from sickness, loneliness, worrying, and from habits of sinning (doing wrong in God's eyes). Jesus can also heal our hearts from being separated from God.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Nearly six hundred years before Jesus healed the man's ears and tongue, Ezekiel spoke about God's plan to heal our divided hearts and bring us close to Him. Reveal and read Ezekiel 11:19-20.

Sin separates us from God. Jesus came to heal us and give us an undivided heart—a heart that loves God and wants to follow His ways. Review the heart symbol.

Let's take 60 seconds of silence for each of you to be alone with Jesus and listen for what He wants to tell you. If you have never asked Jesus to come into your heart, and you want to, use this time to ask Him to open your heart and heal the place where sin separates you from God. You can pray it in your own words or come pray the ABC Prayer with me. Provide a minute of silence before praying.

After the miracle, people continued telling others about Jesus. Who are you going to tell about Jesus today? Today, your Treasure Treat is a heart with a cross. You can use it to tell others about the greatest miracle of all—the healing of our hearts. Giving His life on the cross made the way for our hearts to be close with God forever. Would anyone like to explain that in your own words? Volunteers take turns holding the Treasure Treat and explaining salvation.

THE GOLDEN BOWL: Pray for individuals. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
