



# Hagar and Ishmael

**Genesis 16:1-16; 21:8-21**

**Running time:** Approximately 6 minutes

**Set:** The set for God of Wonders Units 7-10 is designed as a seventeenth century pirate ship viewed from the port (left) side. The Caribbean Queen's bow is stage right. On stage left, there is a raised wheelhouse with a door to the Captain's quarters. Characters and puppets may pop up from several trap doors in the deck and from the crow's nest near the top of the center stage mast. There is a pulley system to raise the treasure chest from below deck where the Bible is kept. For added interest, build windows, entrances, and levels where the characters and puppets can pop up unexpectedly.

**Characters:** Ripply Waters is the fearless Quartermaster. He is a true friend to Captain Billy. Matey (Nigel) is a simple, sweet-natured midshipman with a true servant's heart.

**Plot:** Matey wants to run away because the men are mean to him. Ripply tells him how God protected Hagar and her son Ishmael. We learn God always keeps His promise to watch over His children.

**Costumes:** Ripply: Blousy shirt, vest, belt, boots, scarf; Matey: Striped shirt, stocking cap, short trousers (Capri pants), slippers

**Props:** Bible, treasure chest, swords, bandana on a stick

**Sound effects (SFX):**

1. Intro/Outro music suggestion: "Pirate Theme" from productiontrax.com tracks #19253 or #40794
2. Treasure chest suggestion: Music with voiceover as chests opens to reveal Bible: **"His Words for you are treasures true!"**

**Visual effects (VFX):**

1. Video Intro is available at ResourceWell.org
2. Treasure chest contains the Bible. Whenever it is opened, light shines out and music with voiceover plays.
3. Scripture slide: ***You are the God who sees me. Genesis 16:13***
4. Closing Slide: **"May the God of Wonders fill your sails and guide your path!"**

**Adaptations:**

1. Sound Effects: instead of using recorded effects, have children make the sounds
2. Voiceovers: may be spoken off stage

**Voice over** (VFX: Video bump)

**Ahoy lads and lassies! There be a legend centuries old of a lost treasure, more valuable than gold! Though the pirates searched both land and sea, they could not find where it might be! Until Captain Billy sailed the ocean blue and brought that treasure home to you. So grab yer treasure map, climb aboard the Caribbean Queen and join us as Captain Billy Ocean and his crew unveil the greatest wonders God has ever shown!**

**Matey** (pops up)

**Ahoy kids! My name is Nigel but everyone around here calls me Matey. I'm the midshipman. That means I'm in charge of the middle of the ship from here to about here. But not for long! I'm leaving the Caribbean Queen. Ya see, Captain Billy Ocean and Ripply give me orders, then I have to tell the men what to do and they get mad at me! I can't take it anymore! So, I packed my things and I'm going to leave before anyone knows I'm gone.**

**Ripply** (offstage)

**Matey! Matey, where are ye?**

**Matey** (hiding)

**Uh-oh, that's Ripply. I've got to hide! Don't tell him you saw me.**

**Ripply** (pops up)

**Matey, where ye be? I need you on deck toot sweet! Ahoy there, kids. You haven't seen Matey, have you? (response) Aha, there you are!**

**Matey**

**Arg! You spotted me!**

**Ripply**

**Matey, why was you hiding? And what's with the runnin' away bag? Was you runnin' away from home?**

**Matey**

**No, I wasn't runnin' away from home. I was runnin' away from boat. Oh, sir, I just don't feel like anybody appreciates me.**

**Ripply**

**What are ye talkin' about? The men was just sayin' how much fun they have with ya?**

**Matey**

**This week alone they stuffed me in a barrel, locked me in the powder room, and hung me from the main sail by my ankles!**

**Ripply**

**See what I mean, that was loads of fun!**

**Matey**

**Not for me! Face it, sir, the men hate me because I make them do their chores.**

**Ripply**

**Hate is such a strong word. They're just funnin' with ya. They don't mean no harm.**

**Matey**

**Well, I don't have to stay here and be disrespected! I can go lots of places and be disrespected! I'm leaving! Don't try and stop me!**

**Ripply**

**Wait Matey! I think God has a plan for you here onboard the Caribbean Queen. You remind me of Hagaaar.**

**Matey**

**Who is Hagar?**

**Ripply**

**No it's Hagaaar; she be in the Bible. She were Sarai's servant. Sarai was Abram's wife. Let me get the traysure map out and I'll show ya! ! (Opens chest, SFX: Voiceover with music, VFX: light shines from Treasure Chest)**

**Voiceover with music**

**"His Words for you are treasures true!"**

**Ripply**

Do you remember when God promised to make Abram the father of a great nation?

**Matey**

He promised him more grandkids than all the dust of the earth!

**Ripply**

Right, only Abram and Sarai grew very old and still had not had a baby. So, Sarai asked her servant Hagar to marry Abram and have a baby for her.

**Matey**

That's probably not a good idea.

**Ripply**

You're probably right, but, Hagar married him and when she got pregnant, that's when the trouble started. Hagar started hating Sarai, and then Sarai treated Hagar so badly that she ran away!

**Matey**

That's how I felt!

**Ripply**

But The Angel of the Lord found her in the desert and he told her to go home to Sarai. He told Hagar she would have a baby boy named Ishmael. He promised her that God would give her more grandchildren than she could possibly count!

**Matey**

That's what God promised Abram!

**Ripply**

That's right. It made Hagar happy that someone cared about her. She gave God a special name. She said, "*You are the God who sees me.*" (VFX: Scripture slide)

**Matey**

Did she go back to Sarai and have Abram's baby?

**Ripply**

Aye, and she called him Ishmael.

**Matey**

Then was everything all right?

**Ripply**

For a while. But then God changed Abram and Sarah's name to Abraham and Sarah- and God gave them baby Isaac.

**Matey**

That's a big miracle because Sarah was very old!

**Ripply**

Ninety years old, But, that be a story for another time. Sarah saw Hagar's son making fun of Isaac, so she told Abraham to get rid of Hagar and her son.

**Matey**

But Ishmael was his son too!

**Ripply**

Aye, it made Abraham sad but God told him not to worry- that He would take care of Ishmael and Hagar. God promised to make Ishmael into a great nation also.

**Matey**

There's that promise again!

**Ripply**

Abraham gave Hagar and Ishmael food and water and let them go out into the desert. It must've broke his heart.

**Matey**

What happened! Did they survive?

**Ripply**

They almost didn't make it! *Then God heard the boy crying and the angel of God called Hagar from heaven.* It probably sounded like this: "Hagaaaaa!"

**Matey**

Ooh, I like the way you say that, Sir! Can we all say it?

**Ripply**

Sure, let's try it together! "Hey Haygaaaar!" Longer, stretch it out, "Haygaaaar!" The angel called to Hagar and told her God had heard her boy crying, and He would make Ishmael into a great nation. Then God opened her eyes to see a well full of water for them.

**Matey**

I knew it! I knew it! So, God kept His promise!

**Ripply**

Aye, God kept rescuing Ishmael and Hagar because they belonged to Abraham and God had promised to bless *all* of Abraham's family!

**Matey**

That's beautiful sir. God watched over Hagar and Ishmael! He really *is* the God who sees!

**Ripply**

Aye, God is always lookin' out fer his people.

**Matey**

Sir, do you think God sees me?

**Ripply**

Of course He does! God loves and looks out for all of His children!

**Matey**

Well, could you...I mean could I have permission to stay aboard?

**Ripply**

I thought you was runnin' away.

**Matey**

I was but, now I see it's no use to run away. God can bless me right here. Permission to stay aboard?

**Ripply**

Permission granted!

**Matey** (exits)

Hooray! I'm gonna tell the men! Guess what fellas? God sees me!

**Ripply**

Let that be a lesson to you, kids! Don't go lookin' for smoother waters. God can bless you wherever you are. He's the God who sees us! Well kids, until next time May the God of Wonders fill your sails and guide your path! (exit)
