The Search for Rebekah

Lesson Aim: To challenge children in each job they have been given to obey, pray, and give themselves away.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is the hardest job you have ever been given?

GAME: Secret Message

THE WORSHIP THE GOD WHO KEEPS HIS PROMISES

Read Worship Scripture: Jeremiah 29:11-13.

Sing songs and worship God.

Bless and collect the offering.

Perform High Seas Adventures script or read storybook.

THE WORD THE SERVANT SEARCHES FOR REBEKAH

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God tested Abraham's faith.

Today, we will read how Abraham's chief servant was sent to search for a wife for Isaac. Abraham wanted her to be from his homeland because they believed in God. The servant neared the town of Abraham's brother Nahor. Point to Mesopotamia. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Genesis 24:34-51. Find It First. Highlight Key Verse: Genesis 24:48. Pray. **Today, we will be given a special mission: "OPERATION O.P.G." Let's listen to the servant's successful O.P.G. Mission.** Read Genesis 24:34-51.

THE WAY OUR MISSION: OBEY, PRAY, GIVE YOURSELF AWAY

What does this story show you about God's involvement in the details of our lives? Why did Abraham want Isaac's wife to be from far away? (They followed God in his homeland.) **What did Abraham make his servant do before leaving?** (Swear an oath, which is a promise, that he would complete his special job.) **These O.P.G. folders hold clues that will help us complete our mission.** Distribute folders.

What did the servant do? (Obeyed.) **Which choices show you the servant had a good attitude?** (He made a promise, he asked questions to

understand his task better, and he finished the job.) **Why did the servant take jewelry with him?** (As a gift to the future bride.) **What does it tell you about his faith that he took gifts for the woman he would find?** The first part of our Operation O.P.G. job is to obey. Print an "O" on the first blank in your folder. When given a job to do by God, our parents, or teachers, we should obey with a positive attitude.

What sign did the servant ask for? (The woman would have a certain conversation with him and give water to him and his camels.) The "P" in Operation O.P.G. stands for "Pray." Print a "P" on the second blank. When have you asked God for a specific answer to prayer? As you pray this week, talk with God about the details of your jobs.

Not only did the servant obey and pray, but he also gave his best effort. The "G" in O.P.G. stands for "give away." That means to give your time, energy and best effort. Print a "G" on the third blank. **How did the servant give himself away?** (He gave his time, his energy, his best effort, and the jewelry Abraham had sent with him.)

CHRIST CONNECTION:

2000 years later, Paul wrote to the Ephesians about giving yourself away. Paul's advice to the slaves in Ephesus is true for us today. Reveal Ephesians 6:5-8. Find It First. Highlight. Read. **God wants us to do our best work, as if He was the one who gave us the job. He wants us to obey with a smile, pray for help, and give ourselves away.**

What three things should you do when given a job? (O.P.G. = Obey. Pray. Give yourself away.) **What are your chores or jobs? List them in your folder. In those jobs, what are some ways you can obey, pray, and give yourself away?** If time allows, use the I CAN O.P.G. discussion.

THE GOLDEN BOWL: Pray for individuals. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
