PICTURE SCHEDULE: WELCOME TIME

WELCOME > WORSHIP > BIBLE > CRAFT > PRAYER > SNACK > GAMES > COLORING > GOING HOME

Welcome each child as they arrive. Hello _____. I'm glad you are here! Come and see what we are going to do today. Point to each card on the Picture Schedule board. Today, we will <u>WELCOME</u> everyone. We will read the <u>BIBLE</u> story and make a <u>CRAFT</u>. We will have <u>PRAYER</u> time and eat a <u>SNACK</u>. We will play <u>GAMES</u> and enjoy <u>COLORING</u> a picture about today's story.

Open the Treasure Chest to find today's treasure. Child unlocks the Treasure Chest to receive a sticker of a heart. Let this sticker of a heart remind you to forgive everyone with all your heart. Today's Whisper Verse is "Forgive everyone." Teach the Whisper Verse in spoken language and in sign language below. We call it the Whisper Verse so you can whisper it to others.*

SIGN LANGUAGE: "Forgive everyone."

(For visual demonstrations, see www.signingsavvy.com.)

Each time we say today's Whisper Verse, let's say it with two hand motions:

"Forgive" The hands appear to be cleaning themselves to show that whatever was there is no

longer there.

"everyone." One hand shaped in a fist with thumb on top, move down while the other hand in fist

with thumb on top goes up with index finger pointing up (for a 1). Repeat.


Allow children to enjoy free play until everyone has arrived. Let's sing the "Clean Up Song" as we put toys away before Praise Time. Praise any child who helps. Allow several minutes for clean up.

"Clean Up Song": Clean up! Clean up! Everybody, everywhere!

Clean up! Clean up! Everybody do your share!

Gather and seat children in Praise Time area.

*Today's Whisper Verse: "Forgive everyone," Luke 11:4. The Whisper Verse is a tool to help the children learn a major point in the lesson. It is coupled with sign language or hand motions as a memory aid. The verse is not necessarily chosen from today's Bible story.



PICTURE SCHEDULE: WORSHIP TIME

Choose a child to remove the <u>WELCOME</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Welcome Time**. **Now**, **we will have our Worship Time**.

Children may worship in a large group with other classes or in a quiet room with a worship CD or DVD.

Teacher Tip: To help children identify time set aside for worship, play "It's Praise Time!" as children move to a designated place for praise songs, offering, and the worship illustration. Children who are nonverbal may enjoy participating in the music by playing children's percussion instruments such as maracas, jingle bells, wood blocks, or small tambourines. Children who are sensitive to sound may prefer to wear noise reduction headphones.

It's Praise Time—our time to sing praise to the God who keeps His promises. God has promised to be with us wherever we go. Long ago, God was with twin brothers named Jacob and Esau. Esau was the older of the twins. Jacob tricked his father Isaac into giving him the family's special blessing which Esau should have received as the oldest son. Esau was very angry when it happened but eventually he forgave Jacob and gave him a great big hug. That reminds me of today's Whisper Verse, "Forgive everyone." Let's say it together. Review the Whisper Verse together: "Forgive everyone." Include sign language.



Just as Esau forgave his brother Jacob, God wants us to forgive everyone. Sing: "Love One Another."

In today's story, Jacob sent a message to Esau because he was sorry for what he had done. When we are sorry for what we have done, we can tell God we are sorry. God has promised to forgive us when we are truly sorry, and He always keeps His promises. Sing: "The Lord Is Faithful."

As we collect our offering, let's ask God to show us anything we have been doing that is wrong in His eyes. If you think of something you have done wrong, quietly ask God to forgive you and He will! Sing: "Trust and Obey" while the offering is collected.



Let's see if our friends Delbert and Lello have heard the story of Jacob and Esau. Perform *The Adventures of Delbert and Lello* puppet script or read storybook: God of Wonders Unit 7. Lesson 36.*



God watched over Jacob and Esau their whole lives. God promises to watch over us, too. Sing: "I Am with You." Let's thank God for always keeping His promise to watch over us. Sing: "Give Thanks to the Lord."

Choose a child to remove the <u>WORSHIP</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Worship Time**. **Now**, **we will have our Bible Time**.

Last time, we heard how God kept His promise to give Abraham and Sarah baby Isaac. Today, we will learn about Isaac and Rebekah's twin boys, Jacob and Esau. Let's open our Bible to the first book of the Bible, Genesis. Handle the Bible as a special treasure, leaving it open to Genesis 33:4.

WATCH THE WORD: GENESIS 27:30-35; 32:5; 33:4-11

Read the points below or retell the passage in your own words using the points below as a general guide. To illustrate the story, display a large red paper heart. Have children assist by placing Bible Story figures on a flannel board. Other visual options include Color This Story or a related picture. Optional: To help children focus, have them create a pair of hearts from clay or play-dough as they listen.

- Jacob tricked his father Isaac.
- > This made his brother Esau mad.
- > So Jacob ran away from Esau
- And hurried across the land.
- > Then Jacob sent a message to Esau.
- > Esau showed that he forgave.
- > He ran to give Jacob a kiss and a hug;
- > They became friends that day.
- When Jacob saw Esau's face
- And how he was forgiven,
- > He said it was like seeing the face
- > Of the Lord God in heaven.



What did Esau do when he saw Jacob coming toward him? (He ran to meet him. He gave him a kiss and a hug.) Let's find our answer in the Bible. Read Genesis 33:4 from the teacher's Bible.

Esau forgave Jacob. What does God want us to do? (Forgive everyone.) The answer is in our Whisper Verse! Let's say our Whisper Verse together, "Forgive everyone." Include sign language or hand motions.

Choose a child to remove the <u>BIBLE</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Bible Time. Now, it is Craft Time.**

CRAFT: ESAU FORGIVES JACOB

Purpose: To remember the big hug Esau gave to Jacob when he forgave him.

Supplies needed per child:

[] One 8 ½" x 14" white paper printed with desert scene with animals titled:

Esau forgives Jacob. Genesis 27:30-35; 32:5; 33:4-11

- [] One white cardstock cutout of Jacob
- [] One white cardstock cutout of Esau
- [] One cotton ball
- [] One cow sticker
- [] Glue sticks
- [] Crayons or markers

Directions for children:

- 1. Color the desert scene with animals.
- 2. Color Jacob and Esau cutouts
- 3. Separate cotton ball and glue onto sheep.
- 4. Attach cow sticker to picture
- 5. Attach Esau cutout to end of picture under the words "Esau forgives."
- 6. Attach Jacob cutout to end of picture under the word "Jacob."
- 7. Have the children fold the picture so Esau and Jacob meet in the middle to represent when Esau ran to meet Jacob.

Craft Discussion:

- How do you think Jacob felt when he saw Esau had forgiven him? (Children respond.)
- With your picture, can you show me how Esau would have run to see his brother, Jacob? (Children respond.)
- Can you give your neighbor a big hug, like Esau hugged Jacob?

CIRCLE OF PRAYER/THE LORD'S PRAYER

PICTURE SCHEDULE: PRAYER TIME

Choose a child to remove the <u>CRAFT</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Craft Time. Now, it is Prayer Time.**

God made you and He cares for you. He loves to hear you pray with private words or words you say out loud. Let's fold our hands and close our eyes. As I lift up your name to God in heaven, I will lay my hand on your shoulder. Let's pray together.

Dear God, thank You for making us and loving us. We lift up to You a special prayer for ____, ____ (say every name). We pray for our families and friends. Thank You for teaching us how to love one another. Amen. You may add the Lord's Prayer with the word picture book.

PICTURE SCHEDULE: SNACK TIME

Choose a child to remove the <u>PRAYER</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Prayer Time. Now, it is Snack Time.**

Teacher Tip: It is important to keep a record of all dietary restrictions and allergies accessible. Some parents may prefer to bring their child's snack. Depending on the dietary needs of your classroom, you may determine it is best to omit snack time completely.

SNACK: HEARTS OF FORGIVENESS

Purpose: To remember to forgive others. **Snack Suggestion:** A favorite snack.

Directions:

- 1. Serve snack and drink.
- 2. **Let's sing the "Blessing Song."** Sing to the tune of "Frere Jacques" or other familiar tune. **God our Father, God our Father. Once again, once again.**

Thank You for our blessings. Thank You for our blessings. Amen. Amen.

- 3. Lead discussion below while children enjoy their snack.
 - ➤ Esau forgave Jacob for taking his blessing. God wants us to forgive others, too. That reminds me of our Whisper Verse. Who remembers it? ("Forgive everyone.") Say the Whisper Verse together with the hand motions.
 - ➤ Have you ever done something wrong that you needed to ask forgiveness for? (Children respond.) Did someone forgive you? (Children respond.) How did that feel? (Children respond.)
 - ➤ Have you ever forgiven someone else? (Children respond.) How did that feel? (Children respond.)

THE WAY (GAME OPTIONS)

UNIT 7 GAME OPTIONS

Play one or more of the activities below until the last five minutes of class then proceed to Final Five.

PICTURE SCHEDULE: GAMES TIME

WELCOME > WORSHIP > BIBLE > CRAFT > PRAYER > SNACK > GAMES > COLORING > GOING HOME

Choose a child to remove the <u>SNACK</u> picture card and place it in the <u>FINISHED</u> envelope. **We have finished our Snack Time. Now, is our time to play Games.**

GAME: SAND SEARCH

Purpose: This sand sifting activity soothes children. The items in the bin can be used to introduce the Bible stories or the Unit 7 Worship Attribute: The God Who Keeps His Promises.

Supplies: Bin or container of clean sand, eyeglasses, star-shaped item, heart-shaped item, toy angel **Prepare:** Place all items beneath the surface of the sand.

Directions:

- 1. Children take turns reaching into the sand in search of the objects.
- 2. Teacher and children discuss each object as it is located.
- 3. When all the objects have been located, display them on a tabletop or on the surface of the sand.
- 4. Children feel each item as the teacher explains their connection to the Unit 7 Bible stories. The eyeglasses remind us that God watches over us just as He watched over Hagar and Ishmael in the desert. The star-shaped item reminds us that God kept his promise to Abraham about having as many children as there are stars. The heart reminds us that we can forgive others as Esau forgave his brother Jacob. The angel reminds us of Jacob's dream of angels going up and coming down the steps to heaven.

GAME: THUMBS UP OR THUMBS DOWN?

Purpose: This nonverbal true-false game helps children master the Bible story or the Unit 7 Bible Memory Verse.

Supplies: None, optional: hand puppet or finger puppets

Directions:

- 1. Teacher or puppet retells today's Bible story or Bible Memory Verse, pausing after each phrase to say, "Thumbs up or thumbs down?"
 - If retelling the Bible story, read it in phrases. For some phrases, state accurate descriptions. For other phrases, replace the truth with silly facts. For example, say, **Hagar was excited to be in the desert. Thumbs up or thumbs down?** Children respond with thumbs down. **Hagar was upset to be in the desert. Thumbs up or thumbs down?** Children respond with thumbs up.
 - If reviewing the Bible Memory Verse, read it in phrases. For some phrases, read it correctly.
 For other phrases, replace a word with another word that makes no sense. For example, say,
 I am with you and will watch over you whenever I can. Thumbs up or thumbs down?
 Children respond with thumbs down. "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go." Thumbs up or thumbs down? Children respond with thumbs up.

GAME: FREEZE DANCE

Purpose: To practice the Unit 7 Bible Memory Verse Song.

Supplies: Unit 7 Bible Memory Verse Song "I Am with You" or "You Will Seek Me (With All Your Heart),"

CD player

To practice our Bible Memory Verse Song, let's play Freeze Dance. When you hear the music stop, be sure to stop and freeze.

Directions:

- 1. Children dance as the Bible Memory Verse Song is played.
- 2. Have a helper periodically pause the music.
- 3. When the music stops, everyone "freezes" (stops in place and doesn't move). When the helper restarts the music, the children begin dancing again.
- 4. Play as long as you like.

GAME: THE LORD IS WITH ME BALL ROLL

Purpose: To help children memorize and review the Unit 7 Bible Memory Verse.

Supplies: Soft ball for rolling

Just as the Lord was with people like Abraham, Sarah, and Jacob wherever they went, the Lord is with you, too. He will watch over you wherever you go. Let's think of some of the places you go where the Lord is with you.

Directions:

- 1. Seat children in a circle. Roll the ball to a child.
- 2. While the child holds the ball, he or she says, "The Lord is with me in name of location." (Examples: My bedroom, dreams, backyard, classroom, difficult times, swing, etc.)
- 3. Child rolls ball to another child.
- 4. Repeat steps 2-3 until each child has a turn.

GAME: SCENES FROM HIGH SEAS ADVENTURES

Purpose: To learn applications of the Unit 7 Bible stories, older children act out the High Seas

Adventures scripts.

Supplies: High Seas Adventures scripts for Lessons 33, 36, 37

Directions:

- 1. Choose the script that corresponds with today's Bible story.
- 2. Assign each child a character name and improvise so all the children can be their favorite character, a new character, or just take turns being the same character.
- 3. Act it out!

GAME: BLANKET BALL

Purpose: Children catch a ball in a blanket or parachute to remember the Unit 7 Bible Memory Verse.

Supplies: Ball or balloon, blanket or sturdy tablecloth

Optional: For a more challenging game, use the Unit 7 Bible Memory Challenge Verse (Jeremiah 29:11-13). Phrases for the Challenge Verse may be divided as follows: For I know the plans/ I have for you/ declares the Lord/ plans to prosper you/ and not to harm you/ plans to give you hope/ and a future/ Then you will call on Me/ and come and pray to Me/ and I will listen to you/ You will seek Me and find me/ when you seek Me/ with all your heart

Let's play Blanket Ball. In this game, we will remember our Bible Memory Verse: "I am with you and I will watch over you wherever you go," Genesis 28:15. Each time we toss the ball into the air and catch it in the blanket, we will say a word or phrase of the Bible Memory Verse.

Directions:

- 1. Children stand in a circle holding the edges of the blanket.
- 2. Place a ball or balloon in the center of the blanket.
- 3. Together, the children quickly raise the blanket to toss the ball or balloon into the air.
- 4. As the ball lands, lead children in saying a word or phrase of the Bible Memory Verse. Phrases can be divided as follows: I am with you/ and I will/ watch over you/ wherever you go
- 5. Play several times.

GAME: ACT IT OUT

Purpose: To help learn the Unit 7 stories, children act them out in costumes or with stick puppets.

Supplies: Bible times clothing or stick puppets of Hagar, Ishmael, Abraham, 3 visitors, Jacob, Esau, angels **Optional:** Children can wear costumes and act out the story or they can hold craft sticks with the story characters attached. You may choose one or more stories.

characters attached. Too may choose one of more stories.

Directions: With each phrase, the teacher says phrase and acts it out with hand motions, then repeats the same phrase and motions with the children.

HAGAR AND ISHMAEL

- > Sarah sent Ishmael and Hagar away to the desert sand. (Point far away.)
- > This worried and upset Ishmael's father Abraham. (Pretend to be worried.)
- > God promised to watch over Ishmael and his mother. (Point to God in heaven.)
- > Abraham made sure they set out with food and water. (Pretend to drink.)
- > They wandered in the desert 'til the water was gone. (Walk in place.)
- Mother Hagar found a shady bush for her crying son. (Rub eyes, as if crying.)
- > Then she sat down and she started to cry. (Rub eyes, as if crying.)
- God sent an angel calling Hagar from the sky: (Point to sky.)
- > "What is the matter, Hagar? Do not be afraid. (Shake head no.)
- > God heard Ishmael crying in the shade. (Rub eyes, as if crying.)
- Lift your son up. Take him by the hand. (Hold hands.)
- > I'll make him into a great nation in another land." (Point far away.)
- > God opened Hagar's eyes to see a well of water. (Point to eyes.)
- > She ran to the well and filled up her bottle. (Pretend to drink.)
- > God was with Ishmael, watching him grow (Point to heaven.)
- > And Ishmael learned to shoot with a bow and arrow. (Pretend to shoot an arrow.)

ABRAHAM'S VISITORS

- > God made a promise to Abraham, (Point to heaven.)
- ➤ "Look up and count the stars, if you can. (Point out stars in sky.)
- > That's how big your family will be." (Spread arms wide.)
- ➤ He was special to the Lord, for he believed! (Put hands on heart.)
- > He waited for years, but had no child. (Shake head no.)
- > Then he saw three men who stood nearby. (Hold up three fingers.)
- > Abraham rushed to meet them (Run in place.)
- ➤ He bowed down and made sure to feed them. (Bow.)
- > She heard them talking near the tent, (Cup hand around ear to listen.)
- > "Sarah will have a baby," said the three men. (Pretend to hold a baby.)
- > Old Sarah laughed, "How can this be?" (Raise palms, as if wondering.)
- > God asked her, "Is anything too hard for Me?" (Point to heaven.)

JACOB AND ESAU

- > Jacob tricked his father Isaac. (Wag index finger no.)
- > This made his brother Esau mad. (Fold arms angrily.)
- > So Jacob ran away from Esau (Run in place.)
- > To live in a far away land. (Walk in place.)
- > Then Jacob sent a message to Esau. (Cup hands at mouth, as if calling.)
- **Esau showed that he forgave.** (Pretend to clean hands.)
- ➤ He ran to give Jacob a kiss and a hug; (Hug self.)
- > They became friends that day. (Hands on heart.)
- ➤ When Jacob saw Esau's face (Point to eyes.)
- > And how he was forgiven, (Pretend to clean hands.)
- ➤ He said it was like seeing the face (Point to eyes.)
- > Of the Lord God in heaven. (Point to heaven.)

LIFE OF JACOB—THE DREAM

- > Jacob was traveling as the sun began to set. (Walk in place.)
- With a stone as his pillow, he lay down his head. (Rest cheek on fist.)
- > The Lord was with Jacob who fell fast sleep (Close eyes.)
- > And a ladder to heaven appeared in his dream. (Open eyes; point to heaven.)
- > Angels moved up and down on each ladder stair. (Pretend to climb a ladder.)
- And at the top, he saw God standing there. (Point to heaven.)
- > "I am the God of your father," He said. (Point to self.)
- > "Through you and your children all the world will be blessed." (Stretch arms wide.)
- "I am with you, watching over you wherever you go." (Point to other children.)
- ➤ He said, "I will keep My promise." Then Jacob awoke. (Nod head in agreement.)
- ➤ He thought, "Surely this is heaven's gate. (Point to heaven.)
- > And surely the Lord is in this place!" (Point to ground.)



When only 5 minutes remain, begin this segment.

PICTURE SCHEDULE: COLORING TIME

Unit 7, Lesson 36: Jacob and Esau

PONDER! Read Genesis 27:30-35; 32:5; 33:4-11 with your family. Jacob fooled his father and took his brother's blessing. Discuss how sometimes we do wrong in God's eyes by hurting our family members. Talk about how wonderful it must have been when Esau forgave Jacob!

PRAY! Pray this prayer each day this week: "Thank You, Lord, for forgiving each of us. Help us forgive our family members, just as Esau forgave his brother Jacob. Amen."

PLAY! Draw a picture or create any type of gift to give to a family member who has forgiven you. Give it as a way to thank that person, just as Jacob gave Esau a gift to thank him for his forgiveness.
