Jesus Clears the Temple

Lesson Aim: To challenge children to treat God's house and their own life as special and holy to God.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite thing about church?

GAME: Clean up God's House

THE WORSHIP JESUS AS THE KING WHO IS WITH US

Read Worship Scripture: Psalm 103:8-12.

Sing songs and worship God. (Use the Seven Stars of Lent activity if this lesson occurs during the 40 days before Easter.)

Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Kingdom Adventures script or read storybook.

THE WORD JESUS CLEARS THE TEMPLE

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: **Last time, we learned Jesus called the disciples to follow Him. What did they do when Jesus called them?** (They left everything and followed Him.)

Today, we'll see Jesus wants us to treat God's house as a very special place. The story takes place in Jerusalem. If a map is available, have a child point to Jerusalem.

Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Mark 11:15-17. Find It First. Highlight Key Verse: Mark 11:17. Pray.

When Jesus went into the temple area, He saw the sellers there doing wrong in God's eyes. Let's read in the Bible to check out the whole story and see what Jesus did! Read Mark 11:15-17.

THE WAY CLEARING YOUR TEMPLE

What did Jesus see when He came into the temple courts? (Men buying and selling doves at unfair prices.) **How did Jesus stop them?**

(Turned over their sales tables and would not let them sell.) **What did He say the buyers and sellers had made God's house to be?** (A den of robbers.) **Selling unfairly is like robbing the buyer. That's why Jesus called it a den of robbers.**

What do you think God wants us to do in His house? (Pray, sing praises, give offerings, learn about Him, be kind, etc.) **What did Jesus say His house will be called?** (A house of prayer for the nations.) **Today, in God's house, we will pray for boys and girls in every nation who go to God's house in their own land.** Each child draws a Kingdom Prayer card. Children take turns leading responsive prayer with the name on his or her card.

Child: **May the Lord bless** name on card **in** name of nation.

All reply together: **"Hear our prayer, O Lord!"**

CHRIST CONNECTION:

John mentions the disciples were reminded of a scripture about zeal for God's house. **Zeal is an intense passion about something. Check out the way David describes zeal for God's house 1000 years before Jesus showed His zeal for using God's house in the right way.** Reveal Psalm 69:9. Find It First. Highlight. Read.

Jesus wants us to care about the same things He cares about. What does this story show you about how important God's house was to Jesus? Ask God to give you zeal for the things that matter to Him.

The Bible tells us our body is like a temple. What would Jesus want to clear away in your life so your temple would honor God.

THE GOLDEN BOWL: Pray for individuals. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
