Jesus Teaches: The Beatitudes

Lesson Aim: To know the blessings of the heart God provides for those in His kingdom.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is the best blessing you have ever

been given?

THE WORSHIP JESUS AS THE KING WHO SERVES

Read Worship Scripture: Matthew 5:3.

Sing songs and worship God. (Use the Seven Stars of Lent activity if this lesson occurs during the 40 days before Easter.)

Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Kingdom Adventures script or read storybook.

THE WORD JESUS TEACHES THE BEATITUDES

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: Jesus was transfigured on the mountainside. God said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with Him I am well pleased. Listen to Him."

Today, we will listen to Jesus as we read His nine blessings for people in the kingdom of God. These kingdom blessings are called the Beatitudes. Jesus taught about the Beatitudes and more when He spoke to a crowd on a hillside near the Sea of Galilee. Show the hills surrounding the Sea of Galilee.

Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Matthew 5:1-12. Find it First. Highlight Key Verse: Matthew 5:12. Pray. Read.

THE WAY REMEMBER THE BEATITUDES

As we read the blessings, did it seem strange to hear Jesus say someone who is poor, sad, or hungry is blessed and happy? How do the blessings Jesus described differ from rewards we earn or the good things we are given? Kingdom blessings are very different from other blessings we find in this world. Some are received on earth and some in heaven. They are blessings of the heart that come to those who put God first and treat others with great respect. Kingdom blessings describe Jesus; how He treated others and how He was treated. Whenever His followers do what Jesus would do, they are blessed in a very big way. Read each Blessing Card including the Beatitude and description.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

God's greatest blessings go to those who He favors. 700 years before Jesus taught about these blessings, the Lord described the people that He favors. Let's check it out! Reveal Isaiah 66:1-2. Find it First. Highlight. Pray. Read.

How would you describe in your own words the ones who our all-powerful God favors? How is "the one who is humble and contrite in spirit" similar to those Jesus describes in Matthew 5?
