Teacher Tip: In the Old Testament the Hebrew word "Hosanna!" means save. In the New Testament, it is a celebratory expression meaning "Salvation is coming!" For young children, a simplified translation would be, "The Savior is coming!"

Welcome each child as they arrive. Hello _____. I'm glad you are here! Come open the Treasure Chest to find today's treasure. Child unlocks the Treasure Chest to receive a stamp or sticker of a palm leaf. Today, we will hear how Jesus rode into Jerusalem as King. Let this palm leaf help you remember the people shouted "Hosanna!" and waved palm branches to welcome Jesus. Today's Whisper Verse is "Hosanna!" It means "The Savior is coming!" Teach the Whisper Verse in spoken language and in sign language below. We call it the Whisper Verse so you can whisper it to others.*

SIGN LANGUAGE: "Hosanna."

Each time we say today's Whisper Verse, let's say it with hand motions:


"Hosanna!" ("The Savior is coming!") Fists are bound and then pulled apart to show a person breaking free from being tied up. The fingers move towards the body to indicate the concept "come."

Allow children to enjoy free play until everyone has arrived. Let's sing the "Clean Up Song" as we put toys away before Praise Time. Praise any child who helps. Allow several minutes for clean up.

"Clean Up Song": Clean up! Clean up! Everybody, everywhere!
Clean up! Clean up! Everybody do your share!

Gather and seat children in Praise Time area.

*Today's Whisper Verse: "Hosanna," Mark 11:10b. The Whisper Verse is a tool to help the children learn a major point in the lesson. It is coupled with sign language or hand motions as a memory aid. The verse is not necessarily chosen from today's Bible story.



Teacher Tip: To help children identify time set aside for worship, designate a special corner or area for singing, collecting offering, and watching the worship illustration. Play "It's Praise Time!" as children move to that designated area.



It's Praise Time—our time to sing praise to the King who loves us. King Jesus rode into Jerusalem where lots and lots of boys, girls, and families welcomed Him and praised Him. Let's spend time praising King Jesus as the people did. We can do that by singing praises and giving Him our offering. Sing: "We Love" while collecting the offering.



Jesus came into Jerusalem with His friends. Let's see how our friends Delbert and Lello are doing today. Perform *The Adventures of Delbert and Lello* puppet script or read storybook: Kings & Kingdoms Unit 3, Lesson 13.


As Jesus rode by, the people praised Him by shouting "Hosanna!" That's our Whisper Verse for today. Review Whisper Verse together: "Hosanna!" Include sign language. Hosanna means "the Savior is coming!" Jesus is the Savior. Let's praise Jesus now by saying "Hosanna!" together three times. Each time we will say it louder. Lead children in saying Hosanna" three times.



King Jesus is our God. He is King over all the earth. Let's sing praises to our King. Sing: "Sing Praises."

As Jesus' friends followed Him into Jerusalem, do you think they were praising Him? (Children respond.) Let's walk in place and pretend we are following Jesus; praising Him as we go. Sing: "Let Everything That Has Breath."

Now let's thank Him and praise Him for His goodness. Sing: "Give Thanks to the Lord."



Before we begin our Bible Time, let's say our Classroom Promise with the motions.

With my eyes on my teacher; Point to eyes.

My mouth quiet as can be, Place index finger over mouth as quiet sign.

I will listen to hear, Cup hand around ear.

How God loves you and me. Hug self, point to others and then self.

Last time, we learned Mary gave Jesus a special gift when she washed His feet with sweet perfume. Today, we'll hear how Jesus rode into Jerusalem as King. Handle Bible as a special treasure, leaving it open to Mark 11:8.

WATCH THE WORD: MARK 11:1-10

Read the points below or retell the passage in your own words using the points below as a general guide. To illustrate the story, hold a palm branch or a coat. Other visual options include craft sample, Color This Story, or any related picture.

- Jesus walked towards Jerusalem,
- > He sent two friends ahead.
- He sent them to the village nearby,
- And this is what He said:
- "When you reach the village,
- > A donkey you will find.
- Until it there and bring it here.
- Upon it I will ride.
- Here is what to say,
- > If anyone should ask:
- > 'The Lord Jesus needs this donkey.
- Soon we will send it back."
- > The people came to see Him ride,
- > They spread coats on the ground.
- > They waved palm branches in the air.
- "Hosanna!" they did shout.



What did people put on the ground for Jesus' donkey to walk on? (Coats and branches.) Let's find our answer in the Bible. Read Mark 11:8 from teacher's Bible.

What did the people shout to Jesus? (Hosanna!) Our Whisper Verse tells us the answer. Let's say it together: "Hosanna!" Include sign language or hand motions. It means "the Savior is coming!"



Teacher Tip: Craft and games can be presented at the same time in different areas or one at a time depending on class size and teaching style.

CRAFT: HOSANNA PALMS

Purpose: To make a palm branch to symbolize the branches used to praise Jesus in Jerusalem.

Supplies: Sturdy, green paper; large craft sticks (or popsicle sticks, straws, any kind of sticks); glue or tape; **Prepare:** Cut a 6 inch x 9 inch x 9 inch triangle and four 6 inch x 1 inch strips from sturdy, green paper. Print

on green triangle: "Hosanna!" Mark 11:10

Optional: Green streamers or ribbon may be used instead of the 6 inch x 1 inch paper strips.

Directions:

- 1. Glue the short side of the triangle to end of the craft stick.
- 2. Glue the four green paper strips on the long sides of the triangle to resemble a palm leaf.

Craft Discussion:

- > Who remembers the Whisper Verse? ("Hosanna!") Let's say it together with hand motions.
- ➤ How did Jesus ride into Jerusalem? (On a donkey.) What did the people put on the road for the donkey to walk on? (Coats and palm branches.) They showed they knew Jesus was special when they did this.
- ➤ The people welcomed Jesus as the King who would save them. What word did the people shout to welcome Jesus? (Hosanna!) Hosanna is a special word that means "the Savior is coming!" We use this word to give praise to King Jesus; He is our Savior.

THE WAY continued...

GAME: PRAISE PARADE

Purpose: This game will help children learn the Bible Story and praise Jesus.

Supplies: Pieces of cloth, "Hosanna Palms" crafts; optional: palm leaves and/or green streamers

Let's pretend we are in Jerusalem and Jesus is about to ride past us on the donkey. Let's make a special path for His donkey. Then, we can praise Jesus by shouting "Hosanna!" Remember, it means "the Savior is coming." We shout "Hosanna!" to show Jesus we are glad He has come to be our Savior and King.

Directions:

- 1. Choose one child to be Jesus. Have the other children form a path.
- 2. Have all the children hold their "Hosanna Palms" crafts.
- 3. Give pieces of cloth to some of the children. Let's pretend these cloths are coats. Make a path for Jesus' donkey by spreading your coats on the ground.
- 4. Have the child playing Jesus pretend to ride a donkey on the path as the other children wave the leaves and shout "Hosanna!"
- 5. Allow other children to play the part of Jesus as time allows.

GAME: PRAISE JESUS

Purpose: For children to praise Jesus as their King.

Supplies: "Hosanna Palms" crafts

The people praised Jesus as the King who was coming to save them. What did they shout? (Hosanna!) Jesus is our King, too. Let's praise Him for things He has done for us.

Directions:

- 1. Have children sit in a circle. Have each child hold their Hosanna Palms Craft.
- 2. Give each child a turn to stand and complete the following sentence: **I praise Jesus for _____.** (Mom, dad, dog, friend, food, church, house, etc.)
- 3. Lead all children in responding to each praise by shouting "Hosanna!" and waving their palms.

THE WAY continued...

SNACK: PALMS OF PRAISE

Purpose: Children will enjoy a snack that symbolizes the palm branches used to praise Jesus.

Snack Suggestion: Celery sticks with cream cheese or any green-colored snack

Directions:

- 1. Serve snack and drink.
- 2. **Let's sing the "Blessing Song."** Sing to the tune of "Frere Jacques" or other familiar tune. **God our Father, God our Father. Once again, once again.**

Thank You for our blessings. Thank You for our blessings. Amen. Amen.

- 3. Lead discussion below while children enjoy their snack.
 - ➤ Who remembers our Whisper Verse? Choose a child to demonstrate motions to Whisper Verse: "Hosanna!"
 - > Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. Jesus was riding into town as King.
 - What did the people put in front of Jesus' donkey to walk on? (Coats and palm branches.) We are eating celery sticks. They are green like palm branches. Hold up your celery stick and wave it in the air like a palm branch.
 - ➤ The people shouted "Hosanna" to praise Jesus. It means "the Savior is coming."

 They wanted Jesus to know they were happy He was coming as the King who would save them.
 - How would you welcome Jesus to town? (Children respond.) You can do those things to welcome Him each day because Jesus is with us now and always.



CIRCLE OF PRAYER

God made you and He cares for you. He loves to hear you pray with private words or words you say out loud. Let's fold our hands and close our eyes. As I lift up your name to God in heaven, I will lay my hand on your shoulder. Let's pray together.

Dear God, thank You for making us and loving us. We lift up to You a special prayer for ____, ____ (say each name). We pray for our families and friends. Thank You for teaching us how to love one another. Amen.



When only 5 minutes remain, begin this segment.

FINAL FIVE MINUTES

<u>COMPLETED CRAFT</u>: Take home your "Hosanna Palms" craft. Tell someone how Jesus rode into Jerusalem as King. Remember to praise Jesus as your King.

<u>PONDER</u>, <u>PRAY & PLAY</u>: Distribute Ponder, Pray & Play cards, if available. Show this card to your family. Talk about ways you can give praise to Jesus.

COLOR THIS STORY: "Jesus Rides into Jerusalem." Discuss Bible Story and play Unit 3 Bible Memory Verse Song "We Love" as children color.



If time remains, choose from the connected activities below.

GOT TIME?

SAY & DO: MARK 11:1-10

Purpose: This pantomime version of the Bible Story helps children remember the story details.

Supplies: None

Directions: With each phrase, the teacher says the phrase and acts it out with hand motions; then repeats the same phrase and motions with the children.

- > Jesus walked towards Jerusalem, (Walk in place.)
- ➤ He sent two friends ahead. (Hold up two fingers.)
- He sent them to the village nearby, (Point far away.)
- And this is what He said: (Cup hands around ear as if listening.)
- "When you reach the village, (Walk in place.)
- ➤ A donkey you will find. (Use hands to make donkey ears.)
- ➤ Untile it there and bring it here. (Pretend to untile a rope.)
- > Upon it I will ride. (Point to self.)
- > Here is what to say, (Point to mouth.)
- ➤ If anyone should ask: (Palms up as if asking a question.)
- 'The Lord Jesus needs this donkey. (Fold hands as if begging.)
- > Soon we will send it back." (Thumbs up.)
- The people came to see Him ride, (Use hands as binoculars.)
- > They spread coats on the ground. (Pretend to lay coat on ground.)
- > They waved palm branches in the air. (Wave hands in air.)
- > "Hosanna," they did shout. (Sign language or cup hands around mouth as if shouting.)



BIBLE MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITIES

"We love because He first loved us." 1 John 4:19

GAME: PASS THE LOVE OF JESUS

Purpose: To help children memorize and review the Unit 3 Bible Memory Verse.

Supplies: A large heart-shape, Unit 3 Bible Memory Verse Song "We Love," CD player

Jesus loves you and me. Jesus wants us to love each other, too. Pretend this heart is your love. As we say our new Bible Memory Verse, we are going to pass the heart around the circle. We will be giving our love to each other!

Directions:

- 1. Stand in the circle with the children.
- 2. Say the Bible Memory Verse, pausing after each phrase for children to repeat.
- 3. Have the children pass the heart around the circle as they repeat the Bible Memory Verse.

GOT TIME? continued...

GAME: HUGS OF LOVE

Purpose: Children practice showing love as instructed in the Unit 3 Bible Memory Verse.

Supplies: Unit 3 Bible Memory Verse Song "We Love," CD player

Jesus loves you and He loves me. What does Jesus want us to show each other? (Love.) We can show each other love by giving hugs. When the music starts, hug as many as you can before the music stops.

Directions:

- 1. Start the music.
- 2. Children hug as many other children as they can before the music stops.
- 3. Stop the music.
- 4. Play again as time allows.



STORY TIME

Gather the children and read a favorite story. This can be a Bible Story, a chapter from *The Adventures of Delbert & Lello*, or a story about praising God.

PONDER, PRAY & PLAY

Unit 3, Lesson 13: The Triumphal Entry

PONDER! Read Mark 11:1-10 with your family. Talk about how Jesus rode into Jerusalem as the King. The people welcomed Jesus as the King who was coming to save them. What did they say and do to praise Jesus? They shouted "Hosanna" which means "the Savior is coming!" How can you praise Jesus as your King?

PRAY! Pray this prayer each day this week: "Lord, we praise You as the King who came to save us. Help us remember You are King of our lives. We love You. Amen."

PLAY! Help your family act out the story of Jesus riding into Jerusalem as King. Take turns pretending to be Jesus. Everyone else can lay coats or cloths and paper palm leaves in front of Jesus. Be sure to praise Jesus as King by shouting, "Hosanna!"
