The Great Banquet

Lesson Aim: To see that we need to respond to Jesus' invitation.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite party food?

GAME: Everyone Is Invited

THE WORSHIP JESUS AS THE KING WHO TEACHES

Read Worship Scripture: Matthew 19:14.

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Critter Kingdom script or read storybook.

THE WORD THE GREAT BANQUET

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard

Today, we will hear the Parable of the Great Banquet. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Luke 14:15-24, Matthew 5:3. Let's start with Luke 14:15-24 and see who can Find It First. Ready? Set? Go! Find it First. Highlight Key Verse: Luke 14:15. Pray. Read. Let's read Mathew 5:3. Here, the word "meek" means humble. Read Matthew 5:3.

THE WAY WE ARE ALL INVITED

What were the excuses given for not coming to the banquet? (Seeing a new field, new oxen, newly married.) What did the man do when the people made excuses? (Became angry, invited more people.) The next group invited might not usually be invited to a banquet. These guests were poor and unable to give a banquet to repay their host. Did they come when they were invited? (Yes.) These guests stand for those with humble hearts who trust and follow Jesus.

Who does the man giving the banquet represent? (God.) The guests who came to the banquet stand for all who come to heaven. The ones who made excuses stand for those who won't come to heaven because they refuse to follow Jesus. Who does God invite to be with Him? (Everyone is invited, no matter who we are or what we have done.)

How is this parable a warning to those who make excuses to not trust and follow Jesus? (It shows we need to respond to Jesus' invitation to follow Him.) How is it an encouragement to those who put Jesus first? (Those who trust and follow Jesus are the ones who will enter His kingdom.) What does Jesus' statement, "Blessed are the meek for they will inherit the earth," mean to you? (Children respond.) What attitude do you think Jesus is looking for in His followers? (A humble attitude, knowing how much we need Jesus and that we cannot repay Him.)

Jesus invites everyone to come to Him, no matter who they are or what they have done. Even though we can't repay Him, He invites us to be part of His kingdom. When we accept Jesus' invitation, one day we will get to live with Him in heaven where God has prepared a great banquet for all who follow Jesus.

What are some things we do when we trust and follow Jesus? (Pray, read the Bible, do things God's way.) What are some excuses we give for not putting Jesus first? (Too busy, tired, plan to do it later, activities, homework, plans with friends, etc.)

CHRIST CONNECTION:

The Bible says there will be a great banquet in heaven one day and everyone who believes in Jesus will be there. Seven hundred years before Jesus told this parable, Isaiah described that banquet. Reveal Isaiah 25:6-9. Find It First. Highlight. Read.

Will anyone at the banquet in heaven be sad? (No, the Lord will wipe away all tears. There will be no sadness.) What will the people who trusted in the Lord do on the day of the banquet? (Rejoice, which means to celebrate.)

THE GOLDEN BOWL: Pray for individuals. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
