Lesson Aim: To know we should be faithful with whatever God gives us.

Read Worship Scripture: 1 Peter 4:10-11.

## **THE WORD** THE TALENTS

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: Parable of the Rich Fool

Today, we will learn about the Parable of the Talents. A talent was a large amount of money. In this story, the master gave each servant a different number of talents. He trusted each servant to use the amount he was given to make more money for him. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Matthew 25:14-30. Find It First. Highlight Key Verse: Matthew 25:21. Pray. Read.

## **THE WAY** BE A GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT

How many talents did the first servant receive? (Five.) The second servant? (Three.) The third servant? (One.) What did the first two servants do? (Used the talents to make more money.) What did the master say to them? ("Well done, good and faithful servant.") What would it feel like to hear God say that to you? What did the master invite the two servants to do? ("Come and share your master's happiness.") Why do you think the first two servants were given the same reward for earning different amounts? Both servants did their best with what they had been given. In the same way, God will reward you when you do your best with what He gives you.

What did the third servant do with his talent? (Buried it.) Why do you think the master upset with him? He made excuses, blamed the master,

and didn't try to make money with it.) The servant did not honor the master's trust. The master trusted this servant to use the money to make more money; instead, the servant did nothing with it. How do you think God feels when we do not use the gifts He has given us?

What are some gifts God has trusted you with? (Money, treasures, friends, hobbies, family, abilities, etc.) How do you think God might want you to care for or use these things to build His kingdom?

The master who went away represents Jesus. Jesus is in heaven now, but He has promised to come back. The Bible says He will judge what we have done. How does this remind you of the master? This week, notice the blessings and gifts God has given you. Ask Him to help you use them to build His kingdom. Imagine how wonderful it will be to one day hear Jesus say to you, "Well done, good and faithful servant. Come and share your master's happiness."

If time allows, play WELL DONE game in the GOT TIME? segment.

#### **CHRIST CONNECTION:**

In the Parable of the Talents, Jesus taught us that if we are faithful in the little things, God will trust us with bigger things. Check out the way wise King Solomon explained this same truth to God's people hundreds of years before Jesus told this parable. Reveal Proverbs 3:3-4. Find It First. Highlight. Read.

How have you been faithful to use what you have been given? God notices when we are loving and faithful to do what He has asked. He sees our hard work. When we use what we are given, God gives us even more, just as the master did in today's parable.
