

Worship Illustration: Script King City Chronicles Kings & Kingdoms Part 2: Judges through Esther Unit 7, Lesson 33

Deborah Leads the Israelites

Judges 4:1-16

Running time: Approximately 6 minutes

Setting: The set for Units 7-10 is designed to look like the outside of the King City Herald, a large newspaper building circa 1940's. A door leads to the office. A phone booth provides the place for the superheroes' quick costume changes. The center panel can be removed to reveal the superheroes "Secret Lab," filled with screens and gadgets (similar to Batman's Bat Cave), where the heroes watch over the city. There is a useable fire escape with a door and a ladder down to ground level. There is a ramp on stage right. For added interest, build windows, entrances, and levels where the characters and puppets can pop up unexpectedly.

<u>Characters</u>: Scoop Gibson is a street-wise, savvy reporter who hides his secret identity as superhero "Scripture Guy." Kasey Carter is a young, college-educated reporter (can be male or female) whose secret identity is superhero "Kingdom Crusader."

Plot: Kasey arrives in King City excited to begin his/her new job and meets Scoop, the chief reporter. After Scoop shares the story of Deborah and Barak, they decide to work as a team. We learn God is the one who gives us the leaders and the victories we need.

<u>Costumes</u>: Fedoras, 1940's Zoot suits (high-waist, wide-legged, tight-cuffed pegged trousers, long coat with wide lapels and wide padded shoulders) and/or 1940's dress suit (padded shoulders, thin belt), Superhero costumes worn underneath (capes, face masks, body suit, tights, etc.), "SG" emblem on Scripture Guy costume, "KC" emblem on Kingdom Crusader costume.

Props: Suitcase, business card, note pads, pencils, newspaper, Bible.

Sound effects (SFX):

- 1. Intro/Outro music
- 2. "Kansas City" karaoke from "Oklahoma"
- 3. Heroic music
- 4. Newspaper box: "Good News" or other triumphant song clip. Music plays when box is opened to reveal the Bible.
- 5. Glissando
- 6. Telephone ring
- 7. Distant sirens
- 8. Radio static

Visual effects (VFX):

- 1. Video Intro featuring superheroes is available at ResourceWell.org
- 2. Fallback slide reads "King City Chronicles"
- 3. A newspaper box holds the Bible. When opened, light shines out and music plays.
- 4. Scripture Slide: "Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time. She held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the country of Ephraim, and the Israelites came to her to have their disputes decided." Judges 4:4-5
- 5. Strobes, moving lights

Adaptations:

- 1. Sound Effects: instead of using recorded effects, have children make the sounds
- 2. Voiceovers: may be spoken off stage

<u>Voiceover</u> (VFX: short video intro)

Dateline: King City, a city devoted to the glory of God. But in her dark underbelly there are villains gathering...evil men who seek to steal God's glory! Will King City find her hero? Can she be saved and restored to her former glory? For the answer to these questions and more, tune in every week to the King City Chronicles!

<u>Kasey</u> (Enters through audience with suitcase.)

Make way! Coming through! Excuse me!

Pardon me! I can't be late. It's my first
day! Oh, I'm so excited! I have to find the
newspaper office. You see, this is my very
first time in the big city, King City!

(<u>SFX:</u> "Kansas City" accompaniment track, Kasey and cast sing the following lyrics.)

Everything's gonna be great here in King City, I've come about as fur as I can go! They went and built a skyscraper seven stories high. About as high as a buildin' orta grow! Everything's like a dream here in King City. It's better than a movin' picture show. I grew up in the country where I couldn't afford no shoes. Then I went to college where I learned to pay my dues. And now I'm goin' to be working for the local Herald News!

I've gone about as fur as I could go, I've gone about as fur as I could go!

Granny (puppet in window)

BE QUIET! Will you can all that racket! There's a baby sleeping up here. (All scatter except Kasey.)

Kasey

Sorry! (softly) I've gone about as fur as I could go, really can't go any further. I don't know where the editor's office is.

Scoop (enters through news office door) **You must be the new kid in town. Kasey**

I am! How did you know?

Scoop

For one thing you're singin' about being the new kid in town.

Kasey

Oh, yeah.

Scoop

You here for the reporter's job?

Kasey (Hands him a card.)

That's right! Kasey Carter, journalist! I just got my BA from KCU!

Scoop

Well that's A-ok. A college kid, huh?

Kasey

Yes, sir! I graduated fourth in my class.

Scoop

Impressive. How many were in your class?

Kasey

Five...but they were all really smart!

Scoop

I believe you, kid. I like you, that's why I'm gonna' help you.

Kasey

You are?

Scoop

I am. I know a little something about the news biz. Which paper you working for?

Kasey (Holds up newspaper)

The King City Herald! Only, I haven't started yet. I can't find the office.

Scoop

It's right over there.

<u>Kasey</u> (Heads for news office door.) **Thanks, mister!**

Scoop

Just a minute, kid. You don't want to go in there just yet.

<u>Kasey</u>

I don't?

Scoop

I know the editor and you don't want to go in there until you're prepared.

Kasey

Oh, I'm prepared! I went to college!

Scoop

Yea, yea, so I heard, fourth in your class. But I ain't talkin' about the kinda' stuff you learn at KCU. I'm talkin' about...the truth!

Kasey

The truth? (SFX: Glissando)

Scoop

The truth!? (SFX: Glissando)

Kasev

Where do I find this "truth?" (SFX:

Glissando)

Scoop

There's only one place to get the truth. You gotta' read the Good News!

Kasey (Holds up newspaper.)

The King City Herald?!

Scoop

No! The Herald is a good paper, but the Good News...well that's straight from God.

Kasev

Well, where is it? Where is it?!

Scoop

See that box over there? Open it up.

(Pause.) **Go on. Don't be shy.**(Kasey opens box, SFX: "Good News," VFX:

Beam of light shines from box.)

Kasey

Wowzers! Does it always do that?

Scoop

Every day and twice on Sunday. Bring it over here and I'll read you today's news. This here report takes place in Israel.

Kasey

Jeepers! International News.

Scoop

Yup. You see, the Israelites were God's people, but they had a habit of doing wrong in God's eyes. So, He sent them a judge named Deborah to help get them back on track.

Kasey

A dame?

Scoop (VFX: Scripture slide)

Not just any dame! She was their leader! The Bible says: "Deborah, a prophetess, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time. She held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites came to her to have their disputes decided." Judges 4:4-5

<u>Kasey</u>

So, she was in charge of all of Israel?

Scoop

Yes, one day, Deborah told an Israelite named Barak that the Lord wanted him to lead Israel's warriors against the army of the Canaanites. But Barak refused to go unless Deborah came with him.

<u>Kasey</u>

She must have been very brave!

Scoop

The bravest! She warned Barak that if she went along, the Lord would give the honor of victory to a woman instead of to him.

Kasey

What happened next? Who went?

Scoop

They both went...together! Deborah told Barak to start the attack down the mountain. So, he went with ten thousand Israelites.

Kasey

That's teamwork! Did they win?

Scoop

What do you think? The Israelite army chased away the entire Canaanite army with their 900 iron chariots. You see kid, God gave Deborah and Barak the victory!

Kasey

Wow, that's one rip-snorting story!

Scoop

That's not just a story! That's "The truth!" (<u>SFX</u>: Glissando)

Kasey

Gee whiz, I wish I were part of a winning team like Deborah and Barak. I'm new in town and I'm afraid I'm all alone.

Scoop

Not anymore, kid. I got a good feeling about you. Tell you what I'm gonna' do. I'm gonna' team up with you and show you how things work around here.

Kasey

You'd do that for me? But, I don't even know your name.

Scoop

It's right there in the paper, Scoop Gibson.

Kasey (Reads newspaper)

Scoop Gibson! *The* Scoop Gibson?! Why you're the best reporter ever!

Scoop

Don't believe everything you hear in the press, kid. I get a lot of help.

Kasev

Wow, Mr. Gibson, I think you're just super!

Scoop

Thanks, kid. Call me Scoop. (SFX: phone rings) That's for me! Scoop here! What? Where? Thanks for the tip. We'll be right there! (Hangs up phone.) Okay kid, you wanna be a reporter?

Kasey

More than anything!

Scoop

I'm gonna give you your first big headline! Go in that door and ask for Pepper Rooney; he's the editor. Tell him, "Scoop sent ya'."

Kasey

Scoop sent me! (SFX: distant sirens)

Scoop

That's right. Tell him there's a big fire downtown and you're gonna' cover that story! Got that?

Kasey

Got it! Thanks, Mr. Gibson!

<u>Scoop</u>

Scoop!

<u>Kasey</u> (Exiting through office door.) Scoop! I won't let you down! Stop the presses! Stop the presses! (<u>SFX</u>: "Heroic music," static, <u>VFX</u>: strobes, moving lights)

Scoop (Enters phone booth.)

Now to put out that fire and save King City from danger! This is a job for Scripture Guy! (Exits phone booth dressed as Scripture Guy.) I give everything to honor my King! (exits.)

(<u>SFX</u>: "Heroic music" continues)
