David and Goliath

Lesson Aim: To know God prepares us for our challenges and spiritual battles.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: Who is the tallest person you know?

THE WORSHIP THE KING WHO KNOWS OUR HEARTS

Read Worship Scripture: 1 Samuel 16:7.

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform King City Chronicles script or read storybook.

THE WORD DAVID BATTLES GOLIATH

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God chose Saul to be the first king of Israel.

King Saul disobeyed God, so God sent Samuel to anoint a teenager named David to be the future king of Israel. From that day on, the Holy Spirit came upon David in power. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: 1 Samuel 17:4-9, 32-42, 45, 47-50. Find It First. Highlight Key Verse: 1 Samuel 17:47. Pray. Read.

THE WAY GOD PREPARES US

As a shepherd boy, David was anointed to be the next king of Israel. How might this have given David courage to trust God? What wild animals had David killed? (A lion and a bear.) How did that help him trust God? God prepared David's heart. What experiences has God used to prepare your heart to trust Him?

What did Goliath shout to Israel's army? (He called for one man to fight to the death.) Why did David want to fight Goliath? (Goliath was defying and insulting the Israelite army, David did not want the army to lose heart. He wanted everyone to see God's power.) What did King Saul give to David to prepare him for the fight? (His tunic, armor, and helmet.) Why didn't David wear the armor? (He wasn't used to it.) What weapon did David choose instead of a sword? (A sling and five smooth stones.) What else did David carry with him? (His staff.)

What did David say right before he defeated Goliath? ("The battle is the Lord's.") What do you think he meant? When he defeated Goliath without a sword or spear, everyone knew the Lord won the battle. God used David as a teenager to build His kingdom in mighty ways. How do you think God can use you to build His kingdom?

Battling the bear, the lion, and the giant Goliath were three challenges David could not face without God's help. What challenges are you facing now in your life? Lead the children in a prayer asking God to help everyone trust Him with their challenges.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

David knew the battle against Goliath was not just physical. It was also a spiritual battle about proving God's power. Paul explains our true battles are spiritual battles against the attacks of Satan. We also fight against temptation. Over 1000 years after David battled against Goliath, Paul helps us know how to fight these spiritual battles. Reveal Ephesians 6:11, 14-17. Find It First. Highlight. Read.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can put on the armor of God. That means we can know truth, do what is right, be ready to tell others about Jesus, and have faith. God's Word is our only weapon; it has the power to defend truth and attack lies. God gives us all we need to fight spiritual battles. Describe each part of the armor of God in your own words. Children describe the belt of truth, breastplate of righteousness, shoes, shield of faith, helmet of salvation, and sword. How do you think we "put on" the armor of God?
