THE WORD THE ANGELS AND SHEPHERDS PRAISED GOD CLASSROOM PROMISE

Today, I brought a candy cane. Candy canes have been around for a very long time. Sometimes we hang them on Christmas trees and other times we just eat them. But, did you know candy canes can help us remember the Christmas story?

Hold candy cane right side up. If you look at the candy cane like this, it looks like a shepherd's staff which is a long stick that is curved on the end. Shepherds use them to keep the sheep from wandering away. In our story, we will hear about the shepherds who ran to see baby Jesus.

Hold candy cane upside down. Can you tell me what letter the candy cane looks like when it is upside down? ('J.') Jesus' name starts with the letter 'J.' When do we celebrate Jesus' birthday? Next time you see a candy cane, let it remind you of the Christmas story. Then, you can tell others how the shepherds saw baby Jesus. Let's listen. Hold Bible open to Luke 2:16.

WATCH THE WORD: LUKE 2:8-20

Read poem. Display visual.

- An angel announced to the shepherds,
- "Fear not, I bring good news.
- > The baby you'll find in Bethlehem
- > Is the Savior born for you!"
- The shepherds saw the heavenly host;
- Heaven's army in the sky.
- > The heavenly host said, "Peace on earth"
- And "Glory to God on high!"
- > The shepherds hurried to Bethlehem
- To see the baby born to save us.
- All the way home they praised the Lord,
- Who kept the promise that He gave us.

Where did the shepherds find baby Jesus? (Lying in the manger.) Who did the angels and the shepherds praise? (God.)
