Getting started

# THE WELCOME

To spark anticipation, encourage arriving children to meet and greet one another with today's question.

**Meet & Greet Question: What is your favorite Bible story?**

## **GAME: BIBLE STORY CHARADES**

**Purpose:** Review of favorite Bible stories.

**Supplies:** Poster board

**Prepare:** List some favorite Bible stories on the poster board. (Many familiar stories are listed below or see the Bible Timeline Review in the GOT TIME? segment of this lesson for a more complete list.) Hang the poster board where the children can see it.

**Teacher Tips:** For younger children or non-readers, the teacher may whisper the name of a familiar Bible story to children and offer suggestions on how to act it out.

**Let's take turns acting out some of our favorite Bible stories without speaking. When it is your turn, choose one of the Bible stories on our poster board. You may choose a partner to help you.**

### **Directions:**

1. Choose a child to go first.
2. Child whispers the name of the Bible story he or she has chosen to you. If the child has a partner, give them time to plan how they will act out the story.
3. Child acts out the Bible story without speaking.
4. The remaining children guess the name of the Bible story until someone guesses correctly.
5. Repeat the game until each child has a turn choosing a story to act out.

The God of Peace

## THE WORSHIP

**Teacher Tip:** To help children identify time set aside for worship, designate a special corner or area for singing, collecting offering, and watching the worship illustration. Play music as children move to the designated area.



**Today, we worship the God of Peace. Worship is showing God we love Him. The story of God and His people shows us God has always loved us. He has kept His promise to be our God. He promised to be with us if we seek Him and He has made a way for us to be with Him forever.** Sing: "You Will Seek Me" as the offering is collected.



**God has told us what He wants us to do as His people: to love Him and to love our neighbors as ourselves. One of the ways we can show our love to God is to declare His praises.** Read 1 Peter 2:9.



**Anyone who believes in Jesus as the Lord has been chosen by God to be one of His people and part of His forever family. God gave His Son Jesus to the world so that whoever believes in Him would have life forever close with God.**

Sing the Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse Song: "For Unto Us."

You may also choose to sing songs that focus on God's love.



Perform The Love Sub script or read storybook: Prophets & Promises Unit 10, Lesson 52.



God and His people

## THE WORD

**Teacher Tip:** As you move from worship to instruction, change rooms or locations within a room to help redirect the children's focus to the Bible story. During this transition time, have each child write their name on a card and place it in the Golden Bowl.

**Before we read God's Word, let's go over our Class Covenant. A covenant is an agreement. Just as God made a covenant with His people, I ask each of you to make this covenant promise with me today. Listen as I read our Class Covenant: "I will keep my eyes on my teacher, my mouth in control, my ears on God's Word—knowing God is my goal."**

**Last time, we learned what happened when the angel announced the birth of Jesus to the shepherds. Who knows what the shepherds heard and saw?** (Children respond.) If a Bible Timeline is available, point to The Birth of Jesus (Circa 1 A.D.). For a Bible Timeline Review activity, see the GOT TIME? segment of this lesson.

**Today, we will think about the whole Bible as one big story: the story of God and His people. The first part of the story is found in the Old Testament. It begins when God created the earth, all living things, and Adam and Eve, the first people. God loves all the people He has made. He has always wanted us to be close with Him. He showed this when He gave Moses the Law which is also know as the Ten Commandments. The first four teach us how to love God. The last six teach us how to love one another. Along the way, God sent prophets with the promise that if we seek God, we will find Him. Check out the message God gave to Moses, Jeremiah, and many others throughout the Bible.**



**Let's play Find It First! Bring out your Bible; keep it right in front of you.** Hand out spare Bibles. **Today's Scripture verse is behind the curtain** (or secret door, secret window, etc.). Child reveals the Bible Story Scripture reference: Jeremiah 24:7; 2 Chronicles 7:14. **We'll begin with Jeremiah 24:7. Let's see who can Find It First. Ready? Set? Go!** Children race to find it first. The winner helps others find it. **Let's highlight our Key Verse: Jeremiah 24:7.**

**Before we read, let's stand and ask God to open our eyes, ears, hearts, and minds to His Word today. Who would like to pray that for us?** Child prays aloud. **Be seated.**

Read Jeremiah 24:7 and 2 Chronicles 7:14.



Knowing the story

## THE WAY

What has God always wanted from the people He made? (To be close with Him.) The Bible helps us know the story of God and His people. We are all part of this story! Today, we will divide the story into three parts: The God Who Was, The God Who Is, and The God Who Is to Come.

1. **The God Who Was (Genesis–Malachi): Our 3-in-one God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) made us for a relationship with Him. Because our sin separated us from God, He promised to send a Savior to bring us back to Him.**
2. **The God Who Is (Matthew–Revelation): God kept His promise by sending His Son, our Savior, to restore our relationship with Him. Jesus was born, lived, died, rose again, ascended, sent His Holy Spirit to be with us, and continues to build His kingdom through His followers to this day.**
3. **The God Who Is to Come: Throughout the Bible, God promises that one day He will come back to earth to gather all believers for heaven and to make the world right.**

Who can retell the story of God and His people in their own words? (Children respond.)



Connecting the Old Testament, the New Testament, and Us

## CHRIST CONNECTION

Let's read Jesus' words in John 3:16 to help summarize "The God Who Is."



***FIND IT FIRST*** > Everyone, place your Bible closed on your lap. Choose a child to reveal the Christ Connection Scripture reference: John 3:16; Matthew 22:37-39; 28:18-20. We will begin with finding John 3:16. Let's see who can Find It First! Ready? Set? Go! Find it and highlight it. Read John 3:16.

What must one do to be part of God's people and to be close with Him forever? (Believe in His Son Jesus.) God's people include all who believe in His Son Jesus. God's people are men, women, and children of all races and all faith backgrounds who come to Him through believing in Jesus as their Lord.

Everyone is part of the story of God and His people. Jesus gives the two greatest commandments and the Great Commission to show the role of believers in the story of God and His people. By sending His Son Jesus to save us, God has proven again that He is our God and we are His people. How do we thank Him for this? (Children respond.) God wants His people to obey His greatest commandments and His Great Commission. Let's find these in the book of Matthew. Read Matthew 22:37-39; 28:18-20.

How can you love God with all your heart, soul, and mind? (Children respond.) How can you love your neighbor? (Children respond.) How can you make disciples? (Tell others about Jesus.) Let's play Ultimate Bible Challenge to see how much of the story of God and His people we can remember! See GOT TIME? for ULTIMATE BIBLE CHALLENGE.

# THE WAY *continued...*



Revelation 5:8

## **GOLDEN BOWL**

**Teacher Tip:** Write the names of classmates, local church leaders, and children in other nations or others who need prayer on small pieces of paper. Place the papers in a golden bowl.

**Revelation 5:8 says our prayers are like sweet smelling incense in the golden bowls at God's throne. I'm going to lift each one of your names to God's throne as you pray for each person silently. Then, we will pray the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13) aloud together. Let's pray.**

**Lord God, we lift up to Your throne the name of each child here. We trust You to watch over us and our needs, the ones we say aloud and the ones hidden in our hearts. First, we lift up to You \_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_. Read names in Golden Bowl.**

**Now, we pray the prayer Your Son taught us: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.**



When only 5 minutes remain, begin this segment.

## **FINAL FIVE MINUTES**

**TREASURE TREAT:** Today, your Treasure Treat is a Bible Bookmark with all the books of the Bible listed in order to help you find your favorite Bible stories. Tell your family the story of God and His people.

**W<sup>3</sup>:** Take home today's W<sup>3</sup> Journal Entry as your personal devotional study. Keep your journal entries together in a notebook or in your Bible. Distribute W<sup>3</sup> Journal Entry #52. Complete this at home and let God speak to you through His own words in the Bible!

**OFFERING OF ART:** Until it is time to be dismissed, make an Offering of Art. For your offering, draw a picture of your favorite Bible story.

**PRAYER REQUESTS:** As children work on their Offering of Art, ask how you can pray for them this week. Write requests in a prayer notebook.

**BIBLE MEMORY VERSE SONG:** Play the Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse Song, "For Unto Us," in the background as children wait to be dismissed.

## **GOT TIME?**

### **SNACK: FISH STORIES**

**Purpose:** Children will eat a snack and share Bible stories with a fish or water theme.

**Snack Suggestion:** Fish-shaped crackers, water

**Each story in the Bible is part of the story of God and His people. Many of the stories happen near water or include fish. Can you think of one of those stories?** (Children respond.) **Let's enjoy a snack of fish-shaped crackers and water as we try to remember.**

**Directions:**

1. Distribute the snack and drink.
2. Child prays to thank God for the snack.
3. Ask the Snack Discussion Question: **"What is one Bible story that involved fish or happened on or near water?"**

### **GAME: ULTIMATE BIBLE CHALLENGE**

**Purpose:** To help children recognize the story of God and His people by reviewing Bible story facts.

**Supplies:** Ultimate Bible Challenge Questions and Answer Key for Ages 8-11 (available at ResourceWell.org), tape, two table bells or squares of cloth, table, poster board or white board, marker

**Prepare:** Fold the Ultimate Bible Challenge Question sheets in half, including the titles. Tape them to a wall or lay them on the floor in the order shown on the Answer Key. Make sure the point numbers are facing forward and the questions are hidden. The end result should resemble the answer board in the television game show "Jeopardy."

**Directions:**

1. Form two teams. Let each team choose a team name.
2. Call the first child from each team to stand on opposite sides of the Ultimate Bible Challenge Questions, facing each other with their hands behind their backs. Place a table bell (or square of cloth) on the table in front of each child.
3. Choose one of the children to choose a category. Read the 100 point question aloud. The first child to ring their bell (or wave their cloth) gets the first chance to answer the question. Encourage the child to discuss the question with his or her team before answering.
  - If the child answers correctly, give the points to the child's team. Record the points on poster board or white board.
  - If the child answers incorrectly, the other child may earn the points by answering correctly. If neither answer correctly, no one gets the points. Read the correct answer.
4. Call up the second child on each team. Repeat steps 2-3. The child from the team who won the last points chooses which question card to read.
5. Play until all of the question cards have been answered or until every child has played.
6. The team with the most points wins.



# GOT TIME? *continued...*

## **GAME: I OPENED MY BIBLE**

**Purpose:** Children will play a memory game with various Bible stories.

**Supplies:** Bible

**Where do we find the stories of God and His people?** (In the Bible.) **Each Bible story tells us something about who God is and what He has done for us. Let's play a game to help us remember some of those stories.**

### **Directions:**

1. Sit with the children in a circle.
2. Hold up the Bible.
3. Say, **"I opened my Bible and in it I found name of a Bible story."**
4. Give the Bible to the child on your left. That child repeats what you said and then adds a new Bible story: **"I opened my Bible and in it I found teacher's Bible story, child's Bible story."**
5. Children continue passing the Bible, repeating the previous stories mentioned, and adding their own to the end of the list.
6. Play until each child has a turn. As the list gets longer and longer, children may struggle with remembering the previous stories. You may consider giving hints or children to assist each other.
7. Optional: Challenge children to remember some of the Bible Memory Verses they have learned.

## **CRAFT: BIBLE TREASURE BOX**

**Purpose:** To create a box in which children can hold their favorite Bible treasures.

**Supplies:** Boxes, crayons or markers, glue, scissors, assorted craft supplies (buttons, glitter, sequins, ribbon, yarn, shells, etc.)

**Optional:** Decoupage the box with gold tissue paper. Tear paper into 1-inch pieces. Dilute glue with a little water and spread a thin layer on the box with a brush or sponge. Layer paper pieces onto the box. Spread another thin layer of glue over the paper and let it dry. Draw and color favorite Bible stories onto the box. Cut out and glue on magazine pictures showing things God has done for His people.

**Who are God's people?** (All who believe in Jesus as their Lord.) **We are all a part of the story of God and His people. God wants us to remember His stories every day of the week, not just when we meet together. Every day, He wants you to read the Bible and think about how much He loves you. Let's each make a Bible Treasure Box to help us keep as treasures the stories, verses, and memories we find as we read the Bible.**

### **Directions:**

1. Decorate your box using the assorted craft supplies. (A few other suggestions are listed below.)
2. Write your name on your box.

**Each time you remember a favorite Bible story or learn a Bible verse that is special to you, write it on a piece of paper and place it in your Bible Treasure Box. You can add questions you have for God, your thoughts or feelings about the meaning of Bible stories or verses, or any other Bible treasures you would like to keep safe.**

## BIBLE MEMORY VERSE ACTIVITIES

“For unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulders: and His name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.” Isaiah 9:6 (KJV)

### **GAME: APPEARING ANGEL**

**Purpose:** Children learn the meaning of the Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:6.

**Supplies:** Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse poster, dry erase or poster board, marker

**Prepare:** Display the Bible Memory Verse poster.

#### **Directions:**

1. Choose one of the phrases below. On a dry erase or poster board, draw one line for each letter in the phrase. Include a blank space between each word.
2. Choose a child to guess a letter. If the letter is found in the phrase, write it on every blank where it belongs. If the letter is not in the phrase, draw one part of an angel (Robe, head, hands, feet, smile, eyes, nose, hair, etc.) on another part of the dry erase or poster board.
3. Choose another child to guess a letter.
4. Continue playing until the children have guessed the phrase or until the angel drawing is complete. The goal is to complete the phrase before the angel drawing is completed.
5. After the phrase is revealed, read its meaning below to explain that part of the verse.
6. If time allows, play again using another phrase. Use different phrases each time you play.

#### **Phrase and meaning**

“For unto us a child is born” (Jesus was born as a baby.)

“Unto us a Son is given” (God gave His Son to be our Savior.)

“And the government shall be on His shoulders” (Jesus will one day rule the world.)

“And His name will be called” (There are many names for God.)

“Wonderful Counselor” (The Holy Spirit guides us to do things God’s way.)

“Mighty God” (God is so strong that He can do anything.)

“The Everlasting Father” (God is our heavenly Father forever.)

“The Prince of Peace” (Jesus gives us peace with God, and peace in our hearts.)

### **GAME: TOSS-A-VERSE**

**Purpose:** Children memorize the Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse: Isaiah 9:6.

**Supplies:** Large ball (inflatable beach ball, soccer ball, etc.), permanent marker

**Prepare:** Write the Unit 10 Bible Memory Verse on the ball.

#### **Directions:**

1. Children stand in a circle.
2. One child holds the ball and quickly says the first word of the verse. The child then tosses the ball to another child who says the next word.
3. Continue tossing the ball until the verse is completed.
4. Children may use the verse written on the ball to help them remember the words, but encourage them to learn the verse as they play.

**Option:** Divide into two or more teams. Have teams race against each other to complete the game first.
