The Adventures of Delbert and Lello
Prophets & Promises Part 1: Acts through Revelation
Unit 2, Lesson 7

Saul Escapes from Damascus

Acts 9:19b-25, 28

Suggested setting: The Prophets & Promises puppet scripts adapt to any setting such as a garden, forest, farm, or stable. Once or twice a year, a set change or addition to the set is recommended for added interest. Decorate with colorful flowers, butterflies, birds, and ladybugs. Puppets can pop out from behind a window, hedge, tree hollow, stonewall, etc. For a simple, portable puppet stage, puppets can pop up from behind a colorful blanket hung on a rod or from behind a card table turned on its side. Adjust setting and puppet names according to available puppeteers and resources.

<u>Characters</u>: Delbert the Donkey and Lello the Lamb are good friends who are always excited to learn more about Jesus and the Bible. The leader is the children's teacher or worship leader dressed in regular clothing or in costume consistent with the set (a gardener, a farmer, etc.) The leader helps children focus on the puppets and leads group interaction.

Props: Basket

Leader (Stands at puppet stage.)
It's time to call for Delbert and Lello.
Repeat after me, "Dehhhhhl-bert
Dehhhhhl-bert!" (Children repeat and
Delbert the Donkey pops head out of
window.) "Hellohhhhhhhhhhhh Lello!"
(Children repeat and Lello the Lamb pops
head out of window.)

<u>Delbert</u> (Delbert pops up with a basket on his head.) **Hee Haw! Hello, everybody!**

Lello (bleats)

Yeah. Hello, every-bahhh-dy.

<u>Leader</u>

Delbert? Why is there a basket on your head?

Delbert

Haw! Lello and I made up a game.

<u>Lello</u>

Yeah. We are taking turns being Saul.

Leader

Oh, I see. Like when Saul escaped in a basket!

Delbert

That's just it! Last night Aunt Dora told me how Saul's new friends helped him escape over the city wall.

Lello

But why did Saul have to escape?

Delbert

Some people didn't want to hear about Jesus. They wanted to stop Saul from telling everyone about Him.

Leader

That's right. So one night, his new friends lowered him over the city wall in a basket so he could go tell others about Jesus.

Delbert

Haw! Aunt Dora said it's important to keep telling others about Jesus.

Leader

She is absolutely right.

Lello

Why should we keep telling them?

Leader

God wants us to share what we know about Jesus with everyone.

<u>Lello</u>

Why?

Delbert

So they can know Jesus and love Him like we do.

Lello (nervously)

Oh! I want to tell others about Jesus, too! But ... what do I say?

Leader

You can start by telling them Jesus loves them very much.

Lello

Yeah! And I can tell them how God changed Saul's heart, too. I want to go tell others right now!

Delbert

Haw! I have an idea. Let's take a walk and tell everyone we see along the way about Jesus.

Lello

Yeah. That sounds great. Bah-bye every-bahhh-dy!

Delbert

Haw! Maybe they'll want to play our "Saul in a Basket" game, too. Let's go! See you guys later! (braying)

Leader

We'll see you soon.

(All exit.)
