Saul Escapes from Damascus

Lesson Aim: To speak boldly
to others about Jesus.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is the most exciting ride you have ever had?

GAME: Saul Is in the Basket

THE WORSHIP THE SPIRIT WHO CHANGES US

Read Worship Scripture: Psalm 145:21.

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Commander Cosmos script or read storybook.

THE WORD SAUL SPEAKS BOLDLY

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: The Holy Spirit filled Saul and changed his heart.

If a Bible Timeline is available, point out Saul Escapes from Damascus.
Today, starts with Saul in Damascus. We will see what Saul did after God healed his eyes and filled him with the Holy Spirit. Point out Damascus, Syria. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Acts 9:19b-25. Pray. Read.

THE WAY SPEAKING BOLDLY ABOUT JESUS

What is the most amazing thing that has ever happened to you? Who did you tell about it? Saul was blinded by a heavenly light and he heard the voice of Jesus from heaven. He now knew Jesus was the Son of God. His eyes were healed and he was filled with the Holy Spirit. If all those amazing things happened to you, who would you want to tell? If you could tell others one thing about Jesus, what would it be?

After God healed his blindness and filled him with the Holy Spirit, what did Saul do right away in Damascus? (He preached Jesus was the Son of God.) Everyone was surprised to hear Saul speak boldly about

following Jesus because a few days earlier, Saul had made plans to throw the followers of Jesus into prison.

The Jews thought Saul was wrong to say Jesus is God's Son. They planned to kill him. How did Saul escape? (At night, his followers lowered him in a basket over the city wall.)

God fills us with the Holy Spirit so we can speak boldly. To boldly tell others about Jesus, Saul had to trust God. He trusted the Holy Spirit to give him the words to say and to protect him from any angry listeners. Many of us are not bold speakers. We can trust God will give us the words to say and the courage to tell others about Jesus when the time is right. Just as God uses bold voices, He also uses gentle voices to tell others about Him.

The Holy Spirit changed Saul. If we believe in Jesus and obey the Holy Spirit, we will be changed day by day to become more and more like Jesus. Saul explained this in a letter he wrote years after his escape from Damascus. Part of that letter is our Bible Memory Verse. Read 2 Corinthians 3:17b-18.

If time allows, use GOT TIME? DISCUSSION: 2 CORINTHIANS 3:17B-18.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

700 years before Saul boldly preached the good news about Jesus, Isaiah promised to tell others about the Lord. Check it out! Reveal Isaiah 63:7. Read.

One great way to tell others about Jesus is to tell them the good things He has done in your life. Would anyone like to tell us how you have seen the kindness of the Lord in your life?
