Paul Visits Macedonia

Lesson Aim: To know the Holy Spirit can lead us.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is the best thing you remember about your

favorite Bible story?

GAME: Paul's Memory

THE WORSHIP THE GOD WHO SAVES US

Read Worship Scripture: Psalm 143:10.

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Commander Cosmos script or read storybook.

THE WORD THE HOLY SPIRIT LEADS PAUL

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God led Barnabas to encourage the church and its leaders.

Today, we will see how the Holy Spirit led Paul to Macedonia to tell people there about Jesus. Point to Paul Visits Macedonia. Silas went with Paul on his second missionary journey. They went to Derbe and Lystra where they met Timothy. Paul invited him to come. They went from town to town telling people about Jesus and delivering instructions from the church leaders in Jerusalem. The church grew stronger and many joined. Paul, Silas, and Timothy were traveling to the new churches to strengthen them. Point to Macedonia. Listen carefully as we read what the Bible says happened on that trip. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Acts 16:6-10. Pray. Read.

THE WAY THE HOLY SPIRIT LEADS US

Paul planned to go to Asia and Bithynia, but the Holy Spirit stopped him. In Paul's vision, the man from Macedonia asked Paul to come. What did Paul do? (Changed his plans, went to Macedonia.) Have your plans ever been cancelled or changed? How did you feel? The Holy Spirit changed Paul's plans for good reasons that would help many people learn about Jesus. Next time, remember that when God changes your plans, He has a better plan in mind. Maybe He is planning for you to talk to someone about Jesus!

If time allows, play PAUL'S A-MAZE-ING JOURNEY! (Option 1 or Option 2.)

The Holy Spirit led Paul. Have you ever wondered how you can be led by the Holy Spirit? Here are three things Paul did during his life that can help you be ready to follow the leading of the Holy Spirit: pray, remember, and stay.

- 1. PRAY to keep your heart and mind on God, then you will be more alert to what God is doing each day. Do you have a special time or place where you pray? What are the things that seem to keep you from praying each day? Encourage discussion and problem solving concerning prayer habits. If you do not know what to say when you pray, say the prayer Jesus taught us. Lead children in The Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13) now or during the Golden Bowl prayer. You can pray The Lord's Prayer every day.
- REMEMBER the stories and the promises from the Bible. They
 will show you the kinds of things the Holy Spirit might lead you
 to do such as helping others, forgiving others, telling others
 about Jesus, and praying.
- 3. STAY near other believers when you can. Spend time with friends and family who believe in Jesus. With the Holy Spirit in their hearts, they can remind us of the way He wants us to go. Do you have any friends or family members that help you remember to do what is right in God's eyes?

CHRIST CONNECTION:

Paul was willing to go wherever God was leading him. Over 700 years earlier, Isaiah spoke about volunteering to be sent by God. Reveal Isaiah 6:8. Read.
