Example: Making a godly choice—Paul stayed in prison to save the jailer.

"But Paul shouted, 'Don't harm yourself! We are all here!" Acts 16:28

## PURE: without sin, clean in God's eyes

Example: The jailer and his family were baptized with water as a sign that Jesus makes our hearts clean.

"...immediately, he and all his family were baptized." Acts 16:33

## LOVELY: beautiful, pleasing

Example: Singing hymns (praise songs).

"Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God." Acts 16:25

## ADMIRABLE: deserving to be admired, respected

Example: Praising God in hard times.

"Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God." Acts 16:25

## PRAISEWORTHY or EXCELLENT: deserving praise, terrific,

Example: God's miracles.

"Suddenly there was such a violent earthquake...the prison doors flew open, and everybody's chains came loose." Acts 16:26
