# **Paul and Silas in Prison**

Lesson Aim: For believers to praise God everywhere, every day.

# THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite song about God?

**GAME:** Prison Praise

### THE WORSHIP THE GOD WHO SAVES US

Read Worship Scripture: Revelation 7:9-10.

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform Commander Cosmos script or read storybook.

### THE WORD PAUL AND SILAS PRAISED GOD

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God opened Lydia's heart to respond to Paul's message.

Point to Paul and Silas in Prison. **Today, we will discover what** happened to Paul and Silas in Philippi after they stayed at Lydia's home. We will hear how they were dragged to the marketplace to face city officials called magistrates. Track Paul's second missionary journey, or point out the distance from Troas to Philippi. Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Acts 16:22-34. Pray.

**READERS' THEATRE: Let's act out our Bible passage.** 

# **THE WAY** PRAISE GOD EVERYWHERE, EVERY DAY

What did Paul and Silas do in prison that night? (They sang hymns and prayed to God.) What were the other prisoners doing? (Listening to their prayers and songs.) What did God send that caused the prison doors to fly open and the prisoners' chains to loosen? (An earthquake.) The earthquake freed the prisoners to escape, but they all stayed so the jailer would not get in trouble. Paul and Silas told the jailer that if he believed in the Lord Jesus, he would be saved. When the jailer heard this, he believed and he and his whole family were baptized. How did the jailer care for Paul and Silas? (He washed their wounds and brought them to his home for a meal.) Why was the jailer filled with joy? (He and his whole family now believed in God.)

Let's imagine we are in prison. Seat children. Describe the door and walls of our prison. (Metal bars, stone walls, steel door, etc.) The Bible says the jailer put Paul and Silas in stocks. Stocks were wooden blocks that locked prisoner's ankles down so they could not stand or escape. Imagine your feet are fastened in stocks now.

Even though Paul and Silas had been beaten and locked in a prison, they still prayed and sang to God. They knew God loved them and they belonged to Jesus. Thinking about those things may have helped them pray and sing praise to God even though they were having a very hard time. Everywhere and every day, there is always a reason to praise God—even at midnight in a prison!

Sometimes it is hard to see anything good in a bad situation. We may not understand why bad things happen until we get to heaven. But, in his letter to the church in Philippi, Paul shows us a way we can always praise God. Say the Bible Memory Verse or sing "Whatever Is True." Maybe Paul thought about those things when he was in the prison in Philippi.

#### **CHRIST CONNECTION:**

Anyone who belongs to God has a reason to praise Him everywhere, every day in good times and in bad. Check out what King David said 3,000 years ago about praising God. Reveal Psalm 145:2. Read.

To extol means to praise. We all have many reasons to praise God. Even during hard times, there is always a reason to praise Him. What is one thing you would you like to praise God for today?
