Prophets & Promises Part 1: Acts through Revelation
Unit 4, Lesson 18

Paul Speaks to the Crowd

Acts 21:33-36, 39-40; 22:1-11

Suggested setting: The Prophets & Promises puppet scripts adapt to any setting such as a garden, forest, farm, or stable. Once or twice a year, a set change or addition to the set is recommended for added interest. Decorate with colorful flowers, butterflies, birds, and ladybugs. Puppets can pop out from behind a window, hedge, tree hollow, stonewall, etc. For a simple, portable puppet stage, puppets can pop up from behind a colorful blanket hung on a rod or from behind a card table turned on its side. Adjust setting and puppet names according to available puppeteers and resources.

<u>Characters</u>: Delbert the Donkey and Lello the Lamb are good friends who are always excited to learn more about Jesus and the Bible. The leader is the children's teacher or worship leader dressed in regular clothing or in costume consistent with the set (a gardener, a farmer, etc.) The leader helps children focus on the puppets and leads group interaction.

Leader (Stands at puppet stage.)
It's time to call for Delbert and Lello.
Repeat after me, "Dehhhhhl-bert
Dehhhhhl-bert!" (Children repeat and
Delbert the Donkey pops head out of
window.) Hellohhhhhhhhhhhh Lello!"
(Children repeat and Lello the Lamb pops
head out of window.)

Delbert

Hee Haw! Hello everybody!

Lello (bleats)

Yeah. Hello every-bahhh-dy.

Delbert

Haw! Lello and I collected lots of books and toys and crayons to send with my Uncle Donny when he travels to help start a church.

Leader

Awesome job, you two!

Lello

Yeah. And we were wondering if you could tell us another story about Paul.

Leader

Of course! Today, we are learning about when Paul was in Jerusalem.

Delbert

Were the people excited to learn about Jesus?

Leader

Some people were, but some were not being nice to Paul.

Lello

Oh no. What happened? Did Paul run and hide?

Leader

Even though the people weren't being nice, Paul still loved them and he told them a story about God.

Delbert

Haw! Did he tell about Noah's Ark? That's a great story.

<u>Lello</u>

Yeah. Or, did Paul tell the story of David and Goliath?

Leader

Those are great stories, but Paul told a story about something that happened to him. Can you think of a story you could tell about God?

Lello

Oooh. Like when we prayed for Beaker the Duck's wing to be healed.

Delbert

Haw! And Jesus heard our prayer and healed Beaker!

Leader

That's a great story. God is working in our lives just like He does in our Bible stories.

Delbert

Lello! We can go tell our friends stories about what we've seen God do!

Lello

Yeah. We love our friends and we have lots of stories we can share with them. Boys and girls, I bet you've seen things God has done, too.

Leader

Yes! This week, why don't we all tell someone a story about what we've seen God do!

Delbert

Haw! I can't wait! Let's go, Lello. See you guys later!

Lello

Bah-bye every-bahhh-dy!

Leader

We'll see you soon.

(All exit.)
