Lesson Aim: To know God can give us peace of mind in all circumstances.

THE WELCOME

MEET & GREET: What is your favorite thing to do that doesn't make any noise?

GAME: Peaceful Sack Race

THE WORSHIP THE SPIRIT WHO GUIDES US

Read Worship Scripture: John 14:26-27

Sing songs and worship God. Bless and collect the offering.

Perform the Mail Call script or read storybook.

THE WORD LETTERS ABOUT PEACE

Children sign note cards; place in Golden Bowl. Classroom Covenant.

Review: God led Paul to write about forgiving others.

Today, we will learn how God gives us peace of mind when we trust in Him. Let's see what Paul says about that in the letter he wrote to the church in Philippi. Point to Philippi, Macedonia. **This mailbag reminds us that in Bible times believers traveled long distances to share letters from Paul.** Reveal Bible Story Scripture Reference: Philippians 4:4-9. Pray. Read.

THE WAY WE CAN HAVE PEACE

Everyone faces problems that may cause us to worry. Who would like to share something that you have been worried about lately?

God does not want us to be worried, afraid or anxious. Instead, He wants us to give our worries and fears to Him, trusting Him to take care of everything. God is all-powerful, good, and loving. How does that help you trust God with your worries? Because our God is all-powerful, we can trust He has the power to answer every prayer. Because our God is good, we can trust that even when God doesn't do what we ask, He has done what is best. Because God loves us, we can trust that He will always take care of us, including times when our prayers are not answered in the way we had hoped.

Take the twine/yarn, clips/clothespins, and the notecards out of the mailbag. Hang the twine as a clothesline where everyone can see it and hang the notecards on the line using the clips. **On each of these 9 cards is a word from Paul's list of good things we can think about. Let's take a moment to think about each of them. What is something that is true?** Repeat the same question for the other eight notecards: Noble, Right, Pure, Lovely, Admirable, Excellent, and Praiseworthy.

When you are anxious or worried, how might thinking about these things give you a peaceful heart and mind? Which of these is your favorite thing to think about? How does thinking about that give you peace? How does thinking about that give you peace when you are facing hard times? No one can explain the peace that comes from trusting God. Even though the problems that cause our worries may not go away, trusting God gives us a peaceful heart and mind.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

700 years before John wrote his letter about peace, the prophet Isaiah described it perfectly! Check it out in the Bible! Reveal Isaiah 26:3-4. Read.

THE GOLDEN BOWL: Pray for individuals. Pray the Lord's Prayer.
